

Yturri's Plan for Apportionment Described as 'Mandate'

Portland Senator
Visions Possible
Voter Disparity

Salem—UPI—The "Yturri Plan" of legislative apportionment would "give a mandate" to go as close as possible to a 3-1 disparity in voter strength, a legislator warned here Tuesday.

Sen. Don Willner (D-Portland) made the remarks as the Senate Committee on Constitutional Revision continued consideration of a House-passed new state constitution.

The plan of Sen. Anthony Yturri (R-Ontario) was accepted in principle by the committee last week, over opposition from Willner and two others. The House had approved Oregon's present apportionment plan.

Must Act on Language
The committee still must act on specific apportionment language, and Willner and other continued efforts to get closer to the present plan.

Willner said the effect of the Yturri plan would be to add four representatives to the House, three from Eastern Oregon, and five senators to the Senate, two from Eastern Oregon.

Yturri replied his plan was based on a formula recognizing only population figures. He said it would remove inconsistencies in the present population plan and make it workable.

Yturri said under Oregon's present plan, the disproportion in voter strength could go as high as 4-1.

Meat Every Two Years
The committee decided the legislature should continue to meet every two years. The House-passed version had made annual meetings optional.

The committee reversed its action of last week and restored new broader language on protection of an accused person against double jeopardy.

It tentatively defeated a move to change the effective date of the document from Jan. 1, 1967, to July 1, 1966, but the votes of two absent committee members could pass the motion.

Bus Tour Planned
In Grants Pass

Grants Pass - Public officials and businessmen of Grants Pass and Josephine county Thursday morning will be taken on a two-hour bus tour of Grants Pass designed to acquaint them with the current activities of the city government.

A 79-passenger school bus will be used for the guided tour, the second to be conducted annually by city officials.

Among points to be covered are civic improvements made during the past year, such as new construction in the street improvement program, sewage treatment plant expansion and trunk line construction, improvements in the city water system, recreation facilities and the city's latest park site.

Foreign Briefs

GATT DELEGATES DISCUS TARIFF CUTS
Geneva—UPI—Common market and U.S. delegations to General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) talks met privately today in an effort to smooth out differences in their approaches to tariff cuts.

EAST GERMAN GUARD ESCAPES TO WEST
Berlin—UPI—A non-commissioned officer of the Communist East German border guard fled to West Berlin during the night, West Berlin police said today.

The man, 23 years old, escaped through barbed wire from the East German zone to the Zehlendorf district of the U. S. sector.

CASTRO ARRIVES IN LENINGRAD
Moscow—UPI—Cuban Premier Fidel Castro, on a tour of the Soviet Union which carried him to the frontiers of Siberia, arrived by jetliner in Leningrad today, the official news agency Tass reported.

ISRAELI BROKER SENTENCED AS SPY
Jerusalem, Israel—UPI—Elizabet Altschuler, 39, a real estate broker, was sentenced to 15 years in jail Tuesday on charges he passed secrets to Egypt.

KHUSHCHEV MEETS KRUPP REPRESENTATIVE
Moscow—UPI—Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev Tuesday met with a general representative of Krupp's, the West German munitions firm, according to the official news agency Tass.

Tass identified the representative as Bertold Belts and said he visited Russia at the invitation of the Soviet Ministry of Foreign Trade. It said he and Khrushchev had a business conversation, but gave no details.

Stocks Show Signs Of Coming Out Of Two-Day Price Drop

New York—UPI—Stocks showed signs of pulling out of a two-day slump today.

Rails showed the best gains. Missouri Pacific was a stand-out, up more than a point on news it expects both revenue and profits in 1963 to top last year.

Steels firmed but motors and chemicals were narrowly mixed. A few oils, foods, utilities, airlines and drugs inched ahead. Sears Roebuck gained nearly a point in the stores but Acme Markets fell a large fraction.

Aircrafts were mixed, featuring Bendix off nearly a point on lower earnings and McDonnell up about 1. IBM featured a mixed electronic group.

DOW JONES AVERAGES
New York—UPI—Dow Jones final stock averages: 30 industrials 719.84, off 3.17; 20 railroads 166.31, up 1.66; 15 utilities 140.85, up 0.40, and 65 stocks 256.02, up 0.10. Sales Tuesday were about 4.74 million shares compared with 4.92 million shares Monday.

The lower chamber revenue and taxation committee scheduled an afternoon hearing on the bill to establish a withholding system for state income taxes effective July 1, 1964.

In its first year of operation, the bill would bring the state an estimated \$14 million in increased revenue but in later years the boost could amount to \$50 million.

The bill, one of the most controversial of the 1963 legislature, is expected to meet with favor of the 80-member assembly after it passes the committee. But it's in trouble in the 40-member senate.

Pennsylvania Vets Eligible for Bonus

Elmer W. Donahoe, Jackson county Veterans' service officer, has reminded all veterans of Pennsylvania residing here that an amendment to the Korean bonus law passed in September, 1961, made approximately 30,000 additional state veterans eligible for bonus payments.

The amendment removes the Korean Service Medal requirements and specifies the "career servicemen" may be awarded the bonus provided they can prove that they were legal residents of Pennsylvania Jan. 1, 1961. The amendment also specifies that "career servicemen" may not collect a total of more than \$500 from World War II and the Korean bonus.

Career servicemen are defined, for purposes of the bonus, as veterans who had four or more years of continuous military service immediately prior to the outbreak of the Korean Conflict on June 25, 1950, and who had not received the Korean Service Medal.

Project To Open Remote Lower Deschutes River Country In Sherman County Presented To Resources Committee

Salem—UPI—A \$565,000 project to open up a 20-mile section of the lower Deschutes river in Sherman county was presented Tuesday to a joint meeting of the Senate and House Natural Resources committees.

Russell E. Getty, state director of the Bureau of Land Management, said the project would be financed with federal funds if the money became available. The plan was prepared by a special state-federal inter-agency study group.

Getty recommended construction of a two-lane public road from Sherars Bridge - on State Highway 216 near Maupin - 20 miles north along the east bank of the Deschutes to Mack Canyon.

He also called for construction of three public recreation sites with camping and boat launching facilities.

The development plans for the Deschutes below Sherars Bridge are the first part of a long range recreation study of the entire lower Deschutes river basin, Getty said.

Most of the land is not now accessible to the public, he said.

Getty explained the proposed road would dead-end at Mack Canyon to preserve the wilderness character of the river downstream from that point.

He said Congress is considering an appropriation measure which would include finances for the project.

He estimated the proposed development would increase usage of the area from 3,000 to 75,000 people a year.

Three Alarm Blaze Levels Portland Elementary School; Cause Unknown

Portland—UPI—Fire swept through the Whitaker elementary school in north-east Portland early today, causing damage estimated at \$750,000.

The blaze, of undetermined origin, destroyed 20 classrooms of a building constructed in 1939 and one new addition. One new wing was saved.
