

Lewis and Clark Student Tells Of House of Parliament Visit

The 29 Pioneers from Lewis and Clark college were met at St. Stephen's entrance to the House of Parliament, the Palace of Westminster by Sir Cyril Osborne, member of Parliament. For two hours we were to become our guide through centuries of Parliamentary history and tradition.

Our first lesson in history was given upon entering St. Stephen's hall. We were told that the beautiful fresco, mosaics, stained glass and vaulted ceiling of this chapel were purposely hidden from the eye by Commons when Edward VI, in 1547, gave it to that House as their first "separate home" since the separation of the Lords and Commons during the reign of Edward III.

But try as they did, the MPs could not forget they were meeting in a chapel. In recognition of this fact, they continued to bow toward the altar which the speaker's chair had replaced. Although the Commons has long since been given another home, the custom survives.
