

Portland Summer Term Offers Courses From Five State Colleges

Portland - A student attending the 1963 Portland summer term of the Oregon state system of higher education could take courses from five of the state's public colleges and universities and never leave Portland.

The unique summer term, largest held each year in Oregon, starts June 17 and runs to Aug. 9. An 11-week session, for lower division students, goes from June 17 to Aug. 30. Enrollment may reach 5,000.

Dean James W. Sherburne of the general extension division, which administers the

Portland summer term, said there probably is no counterpart in the nation to the Portland session. The eight-week summer term this year will include more than 360 credit courses from University of Oregon, Oregon State University, Portland State College, Oregon College of Education, and Southern Oregon College.

Dean Sherburne explained that most colleges throughout the nation are limited to offering only courses of their own institution, during either the summer or the regular academic year.

But in Oregon, the coordinated state system of higher education enables its general extension division to offer courses from any campus wherever they are needed in the state. The institutions approve instructors and courses to be offered off-campus and the extension division administers the courses.

The Portland summer program this year will include about 140 courses from University of Oregon and some 60 from Oregon State University. Another 12 will be offered by Oregon College of

Education and one from Southern Oregon College. A majority of the courses offered from state institutions outside Portland will be for graduate credit.

Portland State College will contribute about 150 credit courses to the eight-week session and another 24 during the 11-week term.

Although the general extension division does not confer degrees, hundreds of students take graduate work in Portland each summer, as well as during the regular year, and apply the credit toward a planned degree program at one of the state system colleges or universities.

May Earn Credit
Students in the summer term may earn credit toward master's degrees in engineering, business administration and general studies, as well as education. The summer terms are planned so that students may complete all of their course-work toward a master's degree in these fields without ever leaving the Portland area.

Signature Expected On Explosives Bill

The measure growing out of the requests of Applegate area ranchers for action to protect stock from stored explosives is on the Governor's desk and he is expected to sign it this week, according to report from Jackson County Representative James A. Redden.

The Oregon House of Representatives accepted a conference committee report on SB 96 relating to explosives. Representative Redden asked the House to concur with Senate amendments deleting reference to gunpowder in the bill, which is designed to require safe storage of explosives.

Applegate ranchers register their complaints and requests for legislation after they lost stock which consumed an abandoned cache of explosives.

Funds Sought To Investigate Pests

Washington - Interior Secretary Stewart L. Udall told Congress Wednesday that pesticides are threatening both nature and man.

Udall asked a Senate subcommittee for more research funds to investigate their harmful effects. Organic pesticides such as DDT kill many kinds of living matter beyond what they are designed to do, he said. Udall said residue from the chemicals had been found in game birds, fish and other animals, and may affect human beings.

Credit Executives Expected at Seminar

Portland - More than 150 credit executives from Oregon are expected to attend a seminar on "Oregon's Uniform Commercial Code," June 8 at Portland State College.

The seminar is jointly sponsored by the Oregon Association of Credit Management and PSC. It will feature portions of the new code, effective Sept. 1, of greatest interest to those who extend credit either secured or on open account terms, according to Dr. Albert Dehner, professor in business administration at USC and seminar moderator.
