

Bids Called for Road Construction

Klamath Falls - A bid invitation for construction of approximately four-tenths of a mile of road in the vicinity of Lost Creek on the Klamath ranger district has been announced by Forest Supervisor A. E. Smith.

The proposed project will connect the Lost Creek timber sale road, which has been constructed through a timber harvesting program, with the existing Pelican Butte road. The short section of road will provide an important tie in the forest transportation system, Smith said, which was not possible through timber sale procedures.

Interested bidders may pick up plans and specifications at the office of the forest supervisor, 411 Main st., Klamath Falls, or from the office of the regional forester in Portland.

Bid opening has been set for 2 p.m. June 14.

Use of Aspen Point Will Be Limited

Klamath Falls - Construction work under way in the Aspen Point campground at Lake of the Woods will limit the use of camp facilities this season, according to the Klamath district ranger, Bud Twombly.

Work is proceeding on water system, flush comfort stations, and new table installations, and while contract crews are in the area it will be necessary to close all or portions of the camp to public use, he said.

When the improvements are completed Aspen Point will be one of the most modern forest service campgrounds in Oregon, Twombly said.

Other camp facilities at the lake, including Rainbow campground and the White Pine picnic area, will remain open, and the Aspen Point area will be reopened as soon as construction is completed, Twombly said.

Applications for Aquatic Course To Be in on Week End

Officials of the Jackson county chapter of the American Red Cross have reminded young people interested in the Youth Aquatic Course that applications must be turned in by this week end.

Young adults 15 years of age and over who are interested in increasing their aquatic skills are eligible for the program, which will be conducted at Southern Oregon college and Emigrant lake from June 9 through June 15.

The course will be limited to only 40 students; however, there are now almost 100 hundred applications in circulation, officials said. Candidates will be screened as to their swimming ability, with the earliest applicants receiving preference in the final selection.

Purpose of School
Purpose of the school is to train young people in basic boating, canoeing, sailing, lifesaving, water safety and first aid. Students can earn Red Cross certification in these fields, thereby beginning their training to qualify themselves to serve in camps, playgrounds, pools and other summer activities of the community.

Others Are Invited
Young people from Klamath, Douglas and Josephine counties also have been invited to participate this year.

Applicants who have not yet been tested as to their swimming ability should go to the Medford YMCA Sunday, May 26, at 2 p.m. where they will be screened by Mrs. Roy Wilkes, director of the course. Prospective students may bring their completed applications to the Y when they go for testing.

The cost of the program will be \$40 per student. A registration fee of \$20 will be charged to cover the student's share of room, board books and transportation in Ashland with the balance to be paid by the student's home Red Cross chapter or other sponsoring group.

Successful completion of the courses provides a foundation for students to go forward to instructor status after reaching 18 years of age, officials noted.

Because water can be a good friend or a deadly enemy, the community will benefit by having its young people trained by specialists, the Red Cross noted.

Legal Notice Rate Increase Approved

Salem - (UPI) - The Senate Thursday approved a rate increase for newspaper legal notice advertising.

It was the first time in 12 years the rates for publishing official notices had been increased.

Newspapers having more than 40,000 circulation were raised from 3 to 4 cents per column inch per insertion for each 1,000 of circulation.

Smaller newspapers were granted an increase from 13 to 15 cents per column line of 8-point type for the first insertion, and from 8 to 10 cents for each subsequent insertion.
