# Yanks Lead In Walker Cup Golf

Turnberry, Scotland - (UPI) - The United States got off to a 2 to 1 lead over Britain in the Walker Cup Golf championship today when the Charlie Coe-Deane Beman and Labron Harris Jr. - Downing Gray teams won their opening four-somes matches.

Coe and Beman easily defeated Michael Lunt of England and David Sheahan of Ireland, 5 and 3; and Harris and Gray beat Joe Carr of Ireland and Charles Green of Scotland, 2 up, in high winds and intermittent rain.

Britain scored its only point in the morning 18-hole four-somes competition when Mike Bonallack of England and Stuart Murray of Scotland beat Billy Joe Patton, Morganton, N.C., and Dick Sikes, Springdale, Ark., 4 and 3.

# Veteran Drivers Move Into High Speed Brackets

Indianapolis - (UPI) - With one more full day of practice left before the final week end of time trials for the Memorial Day 500-mile auto race, veteran drivers who have not yet qualified are moving into the speed brackets believed necessary to make the 33-car field.

Although some of the top performances in Thursday's heavy traffic at the Speedway were by drivers who already have put their cars in the starting lineup, several of the drivers still seeking berths had laps in the 149-150 m.p.h. bracket.

The first good weather in almost one week had some 40 cars put on the track during the almost windless day.

Parnelli Jones, who set a new track record last week when he won the pole position for the second year in a row, turned in the day's best performance with eight laps at an unofficial 151 m.p.h. or better. His top speed on the electric eye timer was 151.976 m.p.h.

Bobby Grim of Indianapolis, looking for a starting berth, was second to Jones in the speed department Thursday with an unofficial clocking of 151.7 m.p.h.

# UO, Oregon State Track Crews Go To Modesto

Modesto, Calif. - (UPI) - The greatest collection of track and field stars of the young 1963 season are gathering here for the 22nd running of the California relays Saturday.

But as powerful as all the athletes were, the spotlight was centered on the mile race, featuring Peter Snell of New Zealand and Jim Beatty of United States, plus Bobby Seaman, Cary Weister and Jim Greile - all sub-four minute milers.

There was some speculation that the world mark of 3:54.4, now held by Snell, would fall - and by a full second or more. The track is fast and the forecast is for good weather.

This event is set for 7:45 p.m. and will be televised nationally.

But there are other great sports figures entered, too. The top relay teams in the country also will swing into action. They are Southern Illinois, Oregon, Stanford, Texas Southern, Oregon State, San Jose State, Southern California, Florida, A & M Athletic club and California.

Modesto, Calif. - (UPI) - The 22nd annual California Relays lure the cream of Oregon State and Oregon trackmen Saturday night.

The Beavers have entered a 17-man contingent, including four who will make an assault on the world two-mile relay record of 7:19.4. Jan Underwood, Jerry Brady, Morgan Groth and Norm Hoffman hope to smash the mark set by a U. S. National team, or at least erase the collegiate record of 7:20.2 set by Oregon in this same meet last year.

Oregon plans to enter seven men, headed by Dave Steen, the nation's leading collegiate shot putter so far this season. Steen, whose best mark is 61-8 3/4, will meet New York university's huge Gary Gubner, who has done 64-11 3/4 indoors.

Another Oregon entry will be Mel Renfro, who has the nation's best collegiate broad jump mark this season, 25-6 1/2.
