Floyd Charley Is Honored at Event

Early day 4-H club experiences in the Rogue valley were relived by 100 former members of the Lake Creek clubs, Lake Creek Grange and early day 4-H leaders during the reunion banquet in honor of Floyd Charley, Central Point rancher, at the Pioneer Cafe in Central Point recently.

Charley was the first leader of a beef club in Jackson county about 1936 which was called the Lake Creek Wranglers, and first master of the Lake Creek Grange.

Two former 4-H club agents of Jackson county who attended were Ed Albaugh, Adin, Calif., here 1936-37; and L. E. (Bing) Francis, Susanville, Calif., from 1940 to 1944. Their wives accompanied them.

Traveling from the Coos Bay area to attend were Mr. and Mrs. Reed Charley and Mrs. Kenneth Stocks, Mr. and Mrs. William Jennings and family attended from Sacramento.

Former County Agents Albaugh and Francis reminisced about their experiences here as a feature of the program. Much of modern day beef cattle and animal husbandry practices originated in this early day 4-H program and were adopted by the farmers later. Getting the early 4-H program was not easy, but gradually became popular under the support of Floyd Charley who was attending the agricultural school in Corvallis at that time.

25th Victim of Meningitis Listed

San Diego (AP)—The 25th victim of a recurring outbreak of meningitis at the Naval Training Center here was reported in satisfactory condition today.

Seaman Recruit Richard L. Baer, 18, Wichita, Kan., was taken to the base hospital Wednesday. Attendees said he was seriously ill.

Three recruits have died in the epidemic, which at one point saw 8,500 recruits given penicillin tablets. Baer's was the first case reported since doctors switched to penicillin from sulfadiazine.

Sulfadiazine tradition ally has been effective against meningitis, but experts said the epidemic involved a new strain of meningitis with a "deceased sensitivity" to the antibiotic.

Crater Lake Observes Its 61st Anniversary

Crater Lake National park observed its 61st birthday this week.

The area became the country's fifth national park on May 22, 1902, when President Theodore Roosevelt signed the Act of Congress creating the park and assuring preservation of the area's natural features.

The action culminated 17 years of dedicated work by William G. Steel, "Father of Crater Lake National Park," according to Superintendent W. Ward Yeager.

Tradition relates that young Steel learned of Crater lake as a schoolboy in Kansas. One particular article he read in the local newspaper described the lake. He saw the lake for the first time Aug. 16, 1885, and was so inspired, he devoted much of his time in succeeding years to the establishment of the area as a national park.

He served as the park's second superintendent, from 1913 to 1916, and subsequently became park commissioner, a position he held until his death in 1934. The national park now hosts more than one-half million visitors each year.
