

Construction of New Lodge at Happy Camp Will Start Soon

 Happy Camp—Construction of the first part of a new lodge along the Klamath river, one mile west of Happy Camp, is expected to get under way soon.

The lodge, to be called the Diamond D Lodge, Inc., is scheduled to be built over a five-year period, financed through a federal Area Redevelopment Administration loan.

But because of community interest, the portion of this lodge which will house a bowling alley, has been withdrawn from the ARA loan application and will be built immediately.

According to J. C. Mitchell, architect with Designs Unlimited of San Jose, who is designing the Swiss-Chalet decor lodge facilities, the building which will house the bowling lanes should be under construction about June 1 and should be completed by early fall.

According to Mitchell, soil samples at the site have been taken and survey work has been done by Orel Lewis, a private surveyor.

The original bowling lane facility will house eight lanes in a one-story, 8,620 square foot structure. Provisions will be made to allow for future expansion to 12 or 16 lanes. The lanes, pin-setting equipment, ball returns and other equipment will be of the most modern available, including automatic pin setters.

Located in the front portion of the building will be a cocktail lounge, snack-bar, a view-lounge area, lobby with sales counter, restrooms and promenade.

Full treatment will be given to accommodation of league bowling and special consideration to having facilities such as snack bar to encourage young people. Plans for league bowling should be getting under way soon, Mitchell said, in order for the leagues

to start as soon as possible after the fall opening.

Included in Plan

Included in the ARA loan application for the two-year plan are (1) hotel-lodge with an ultimate 60 motel-cabin units, a restaurant to accommodate approximately 30 persons at one time with banquet facilities; additional, and a cocktail lounge with room for dancing; (2) a group cabin with complete facilities for 24 persons in one party; (3) a 25-30 unit trailer park with small general store, including sporting goods and off-sale liquor; and (4) dock and boat facilities.

Included in the five-year plan are in addition to those already mentioned are (1) dude ranch with bunkhouse facilities and packing facilities for camping trips into the primitive area and other similar activities; (2) golf course with 9 holes with suitable country club facilities, tennis courts; (3) a community hall and chapel structure; (4) small community shopping center; (5) twenty cottages with 1 to 3 bedrooms

The proposed site, owned by Dr. and Mrs. George Chambers of Happy Camp, being approximately one-mile downstream from Happy Camp, places the facilities within easy reach of the local population in addition to being adjacent to the local airport and situated on Highway 98 (Klamath River highway). Just across the highway from the site is the Klamath river, fast becoming one of the more popular streams along with its many tributaries in northern California.

The lodge and cabins project is designed to be multi-

purpose for appeal to travelers, sportsmen, businessmen and local residents. Included in the plans for the lodge facilities are an Olympic type swimming pool, shuffleboard, and ping pong, for the recreation of the guests. The lodge design will be of Swiss-Chalet decor throughout.

Explorer, Author To Relate Biblical Land Experiences

Dr. Wendell Phillips, internationally known explorer and author, will speak in Medford at 8 p.m., Friday, May 31, at the First Presbyterian church. It is open to the public.

Dr. Phillips, author of the book, "Qutaban and Sheba," will tell of his archeological explorations in several of the Biblical kingdoms of Arabia.

He is founder and president of the American Foundation of the Study of Man and is economic advisor to the Sultan of Oman, a southeast Arabian nation often called Muscat and Oman, and director general of antiquities of that nation.

Earlier this year his party entered the ancient capital city of Saba in Aden, where he plans to return in October. He also entered Mareb, the capital city of the Queen of Sheba and discovered the ancient spice capital city of Samar.

film "Expedition, Queen of Sheba." The speaker has established an international reputation for organization of and participation in archeological expeditions, particularly in Africa and Arabia.

During one 26-months safari in Africa discoveries were made of bones of the Swartzkrans man-ape, nine feet tall and said to have lived one to two million years ago. The explorers found archeological proof that the Libyan desert was once a vast sea.
