

Pentecost Sunday To Be Observed At First Nazarene

Fifty days after the resurrection of Christ the Holy Spirit was given to the waiting disciples on a feast day of the Jews, the Day of Pentecost. This day has been observed as Whitsunday on the Christian calendar through the years. It is considered the birthday of the Christian church.
