

Suspended Wrestlers Pay Owen

Jack Dalton and his brother, Jim, along with Sliat Gorky, professional wrestlers who failed to appear as scheduled at the Medford armory on May 23, have paid Promoter Elton Owen \$100 to partially reimburse him for his expenses when he was forced to cancel the program.

They explained that their car broke down as they were en route to Medford and, although they hailed other motorists for more than an hour, they were unable to secure a ride. They finally secured a tow truck and returned their disabled auto to Portland.

Call Unanswered From Portland, they said they attempted to telephone Owen at the armory around 7 p.m. but the call went unanswered. Army personnel explained no one is on duty to answer the telephone at that hour.

The wrestlers said they were unable to secure bus or airplane transportation to arrive in Medford in time for the match. They are under indefinite suspension by the Medford state athletic commission for their failure to appear. The Portland boxing and wrestling commission and the National Wrestling alliance threatened them with 30-day suspension unless they paid Owen an agreed amount. The \$100 payment was the result. They are still under suspension in Medford, however.

Los Angeles — (AP) — New Zealander Peter Snell, in analyzing his easy victory Friday night in the half mile, remarked that American Jim Beatty "has nothing to lose" if the pair meet next week in the celebrated mile event.

"If he beats me," said Snell, "we will be back where we started before Modesto." The New Zealander easily won the half-mile last night in the Southern Pacific Amateur Athletic Union (SPA) meet held at Occidental college. He was clocked in 1:48.0, well over his record of 1:45.1.

Beatty chalked up an equally easy triumph in the mile with a time of 4:00.8. He set his own pace and was timed in 1:58.8 for the half mile, but drew away in the third lap to finish a full six seconds ahead of second place Leroy Neal of Occidental.
