## Feeding the Family

**Peach Marble Cakes**  
Keep this recipe handy for repeating time and again. Bake it and take it in the pan. Spread one-fourth cup of butter in bottom of 11x7x2 inch baking pan. Mix two-thirds cup brown sugar (packed) and two teaspoons grated orange rind and spritz over butter. Arrange two cups canned cling peach slices in rows over sugar. Prepare one package marble cake mix according to package directions and pour over fruit. Bake in 350 degree oven, 40 to 50 minutes or until cake is done. Invert to stand 10 minutes. Allow to cool before serving plate to remove cake. Serve it warm or cooled plain, with cream pitcher on the side, with whipped cream or dairy sour cream in sauceboat for passing. **Cola Coolers**

The younger crowd will react instantly and with excitement to the suggestion that you stir up a "float" of any kind. Here are some cola coolers of distinction. Put two tablespoons cream in a tall glass. Add spoonful or scoop of cherry ice cream; fill glass with chilled cola soft drink. Put one-half teaspoon mint extract in bottom of tall glass. Fill glass with cola drink. Add generous spoonful or small scoop of peppermint ice cream. For two coolers, fill two large glasses one-third full of fresh orange juice. Add a scoop of vanilla ice cream. Fill glass with chilled bottled cola drink. One 12-ounce bottle of cola will make two sodas. **Exciting Fruit Pick-Up**

Put bottle cola soft drink into ice cube tray and chill until firm. This will never get really firm. Mix melon balls, fresh or frozen; place in dessert dishes; put several cubes of frozen cola drink on top of dish of melon balls. Cubes will dissolve quickly and flavor the melon. Serve with wedge of lemon. **Week End Ways With Hamburger**

For many workers and players alike a handy supply of freshly ground beef and plenty of buns to be assembled in new ways is always welcome. Hamburgers become something extra special when served Hawaiian style like this: For eight patties or four servings, mix one pound ground beef with one onion, finely chopped. Shape into eight one-half-inch thick patties. Combine one clove garlic, finely minced, with one-half cup soy sauce and one-half teaspoon ground ginger. Pour sauce over patties; let stand 30 minutes. Drain and grill or broil. Serve "as is" with or in heated, buttered buns.

Broiled or fresh pineapple cut in small wedges or finger length pieces and/or small wedges or finger-length pieces and slices of papaya are terrific flavor additions. Another hamburger special. Serve regular or barbecued burgers with a selection of chopped onions, thousand island dressing, mayonnaise, hot and cold mustard, sliced tomatoes, pickles or unpeeled cucumber slices or other favorite accompaniment and let each eater assemble his own. **Week End Ways With Frankfurters**

## Small Worlds Around Us

**Sowbug Could Be Called Earth's Strangest Creature**  
You would be very ignorant and holler "misrepresentation, fraud and humbug" if you paid admission to an attraction billed as "the earth's strangest creature, and alive" and found a sowbug in a little grass cage. You would demand your money back maintaining, and rightly, that you could see plenty of those things in your own backyard. However, the sideshow Barker, or the colorful banner, would be telling the truth, for this very common little sowbug is just about the strangest creature alive on this earth today.

It's difficult to understand why the sowbug should still be here at all when most of its relatives still live in the sea. In spite of its commonness, not too much of the life history of this little character is known. It has little importance, occupying as it does a rather low niche in the living world; in fact, the sowbug is seldom seen, and is infrequently worried about, in spite of the enormous numbers of them that inhabit this earth with us. **Who Knows?**

Science is pretty vague as to why the sowbug should have left all its many relatives safely cradled in the sea and come to live upon the land. In fact, the sowbug is related closely to the crayfish (which is not a fish), to the crabs that see so plentiful in the sea and to the barnacle that buds its shell and attaches it to underwater objects. But the sowbug lives under nothing leaves in a woodlot, in the dank dampness of a little used potato bin or under an undisturbed board in a vacant lot.

The sowbug is a dark or slate color, seldom a half inch long, and has the peculiar habit of rolling itself into a ball when disturbed, or even when the sunlight hits it. This action is reason enough, probably, to have prompted someone to name the creature "pill-bug." When whatever frightened the sowbug goes away, the creature again resumes its normal position and proceeds to go on eating delicate vegetable matter. **Remembers Mama**

The sowbug is a true land dwelling creature, but it still retains some instinctive remembrance of its ancient ancestral home for it always lives in a damp environment. It can't seem to get entirely away from the fact it is actually an isopod. Forsaking its close relatives some time in the very long ago, the sowbug crawled out of the sea and became a land dweller. As time goes on, if it does continue into the indefinite future, the sowbug in another million years may even abandon the damp darkness and come into the light. In the meantime, under the rotting leaves of the forest floor, or under an old pile of molder newspapers, or in a seldom used potato bin, still lives the sowbug, a strange little creature with 10 legs, two pair of antennae and breathing air by means of gills.
