**REPLIES ON 'DENUCLEARIZATION' PROPOSAL**  
 Mexico City—Foreign Minister Manuel Tello says 10 Latin American countries have sent "warm" but noncommittal replies to a note proposing the "denuclearization" of nations south of the border.

Tello told newsmen Wednesday he believes the plan, put forward by Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Ecuador and Mexico, eventually will be adopted.

**SOVIET REPRESENTATIVES TO ATTEND FUNERAL**  
 Moscow—The Russian Orthodox church announced today it will send three representatives to the funeral of Pope John XXIII.

A spokesman for the church in Moscow told UPI that the three—all of whom are currently in Geneva on an international assignment—would proceed to Italy for the funeral.

 Bonn—Chancellor Konrad Adenauer received the American Legion's Golden Freedom medal in ceremonies here Wednesday.

The medal was presented by Ames Powers, president of the Legion. "I am extraordinarily moved," Adenauer told him. "Let me assure you that it is the finest decoration I have."

Tobacco dropped sharply on a Florida Supreme Court ruling that a cigarette manufacturer can be held liable if a person's death is caused from smoking its products. IBM and Minneapolis-Honeywell went ahead in the electronics but Motorola eased a point. Santa Fe and Missouri Pacific showed little response to news the two roads were discussing merger possibilities.

# Brown's Death Moratorium Killed

Sacramento, Calif.—(UPI)—Gov. Edmund G. Brown's latest attempt to close the California gas chamber died Wednesday night in a hostile Senate committee.

The governor, who earlier had bombarded committee members with public statements and personal appeals, immediately issued another statement predicting that capital punishment will someday "be abandoned as surely as other barbaric customs."

Brown's bill at this legislative session was a compromise measure that would have closed the gas chamber for only four years to all but certain kinds of criminals.

Exempted from its provisions would be double-murders, kidnap-murders, persons who

slay police officers and prisoners who kill while in prison.

At earlier sessions he tried and failed to get complete abolition, most dramatically in 1960 when kidnap-rape and best selling author Caryl Chessman waited on death row.
