

Kogap Buys Tracts Of National Forest Timber at Auction

No bids were received this week for the 580,000 board feet of national forest timber in the Ashland Loop roadside area, Ashland ranger district, Rogue River National forest, Kogap Manufacturing com-

pany, Medford, was high bidder for 7,700,000 board feet of timber in the Brown Mountain area, Ashland ranger district. The high bid totaled \$262,516.15, compared to the forest service appraised price of

\$172,516.15, an increase of 52 per cent. Next high bidder in the oral auction for the timber was Aedon Corporation. The other bidder was Mountain Fir Lumber company of Grants Pass.

The timber in the unit consisted of 3,495,000 board feet of Douglas-fir bid in at \$34.75 per thousand board feet; 1,040,000 board feet of western white pine and other pines bid at \$47 per thousand; 640,000 board feet of Shasta red fir bid at \$25 per thousand, and 2,525,000 board feet of white fir and other species bid at \$28 per thousand.

Kogap Manufacturing company was high bidder Wednesday for 8,180,000 board feet of timber in the Woodruff Blowdown area, Union Creek ranger district. The high bid totaled \$152,289.50, compared to the appraised price of \$150,180, an increase of 1 per cent. Next high bidder was Fir-Ply, Inc., Medford. The other bidder was Olson - Lawyer Lumber, Inc. Timber in this unit consisted of 4,890,000 board feet of Douglas-fir bid at \$26.95 per thousand; 1,120,000 board feet of ponderosa pine, sugar pine, 1000 board feet of white fir and other species bid at \$12 per thousand, and 150,000 board feet of white fir and other species bid at \$12 per thousand.

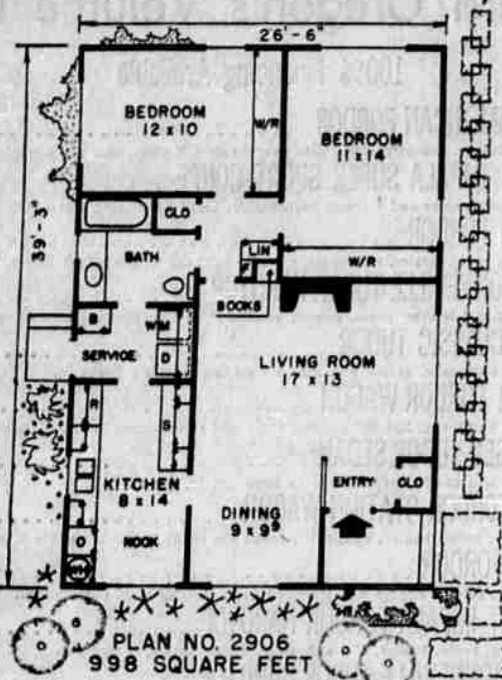

This Week's Plan for Home Builders

 Although it is small in scale, this modest home has been imaginatively planned to extract the fullest measure of livability and comfort from the allotted space. The compact design, which can be easily maintained, is also very economical to build. The front door is protected by the roofed porch. The entry is well lighted through a stationary window next to the door. A partial wall separates the entry from the dining ell. This area could be decorated very appealingly by using any number of materials as a screen which would extend from the top of this wall to the ceiling. A guest closet opens to the entry. The living room and dining ell have been combined to form one sizeable room which is made even more spacious - looking by the use of large windows. The wide fireplace can be enjoyed from both the living room and dining ell.

Laundry facilities plus a broom closet are in the service. If preferred, a laundry tray could be substituted for the present space allotted to the dryer. Wall cabinets are above the laundry facilities. The service door opens to a concrete landing where a walk leads to the detached double garage. Plans for this garage are included with your house plans. The bath is so located that two baths are not necessary. It is accessible from both the service - kitchen area and the bedroom hall. The pullman lavatory gives the bathroom a touch of luxury and offers an abundance of storage space. Sliding doors enclose the tub and overhead shower. Opens to Bedroom Hall. A storage closet opens to the bedroom hall. In another corner there is a linen, furnace and a built-in book case which opens to the living room. One of the most prevalent omissions in the average small home is sufficient storage. Besides the storage already mentioned, this home can boast of 21' of wardrobe space. Stone veneer plus two low hanging light fixtures which illuminate the stone planter add a touch of elegance to the exterior of this exciting small home.
