Walter Richard Spear, III, Medford, will receive a commission as second lieutenant in the U. S. Army Reserve, and Stephen D. Gray, Ashland, will receive a gold medal as an Air Force Reserve Officers Training Corps award.

Concerning California, Nixon advised that state residents not lose the "pioneer spirit." "It could be lost if California became smug," he said.

Salem - AP - Twelve new appointive offices to be filled by Gov. Mark Hatfield, and about 1,800 new state jobs were created by the 1963 Legislature, it has been revealed.

The Department of Higher Education got the largest block of new positions, more than 900. About 450 of these are additions to the teaching staff, according to Freeman Holmer, director of the department of finance and administration.

The State Public Welfare department got 261 job openings. Holmer said 168 of these were new "professional positions," mostly case workers.

The governor will name two members to the advisory committee for review and recommendation of permits for selling logs for process outside the United States. The state forester will name the third member.

There were 22,300 authorized jobs in state service at the end of the 1959-61 biennium.

This grew to an estimated 24,777 for the biennium which ends June 30.

The governor's budget recommendations called for more than 26,000 state jobs for the 1963-65 biennium.

New appointments that can be made by Hatfield were listed by his legal advisor, Loren Hicks.

The list includes two new circuit judges - one each for Lane and Washington counties - who will take office next January.

Hatfield can name a state fire marshal on July 1. He will be able to name a

director of the newly created Department of Commerce which will be established in July of 1964. It is expected the commissioner will be named some time before the effective date of the new department.

Hatfield was authorized to name one Oregon representative to the Interstate Vehicle Compact commission. This position will be open on Sept. 2.

He will name five psychologists to the Board of Psychologists Examiners which was created by the legislature.

Hicks, who is still reviewing measures adopted by the legislature, said he believed these were the only new appointments opened to Hatfield, but that more than 100 bills adopted in the final days of the session have not yet reached his desk for review.
