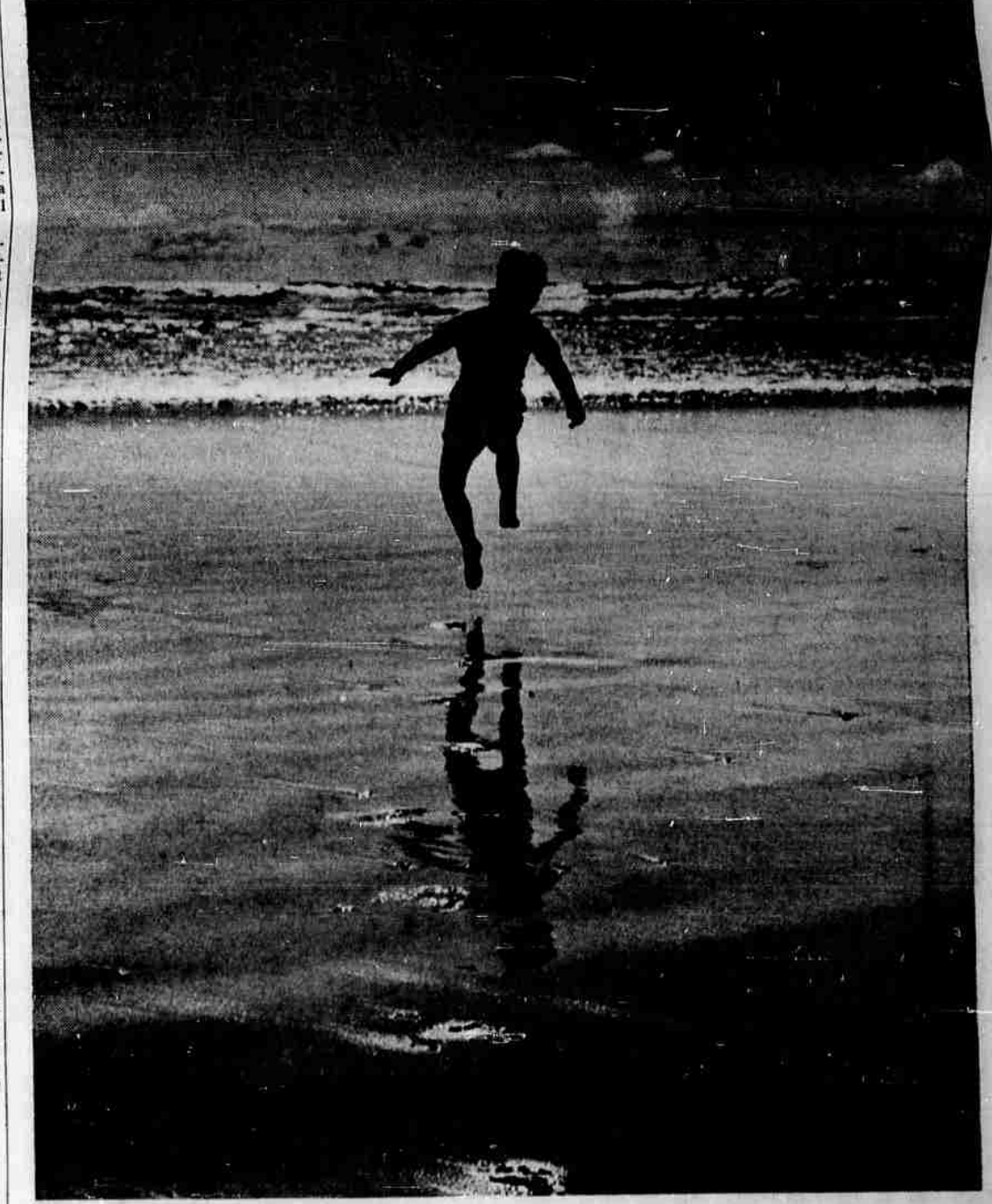
Greek Premier Quits in Dispute Over Pending Trip
