**Supervisor Eyes U. S. Spending**

Manila - (UPI) - The man who runs the U.S. foreign aid program in the Philippines flies in a two-seater airplane and drives through mud to see how American money is being spent.

James H. Ingersoll, 44, a former Chicago industrialist, supervises spending and lending of millions of dollars yearly in the Philippines, a former American colony in Southeast Asia.

It takes a lot of traveling by air, sea and water over back roads and remote passages to inspect America's economic assistance program in the 7,000 islands which comprise the Philippine Archipelago.

In a typical day, Ingersoll flew from his headquarters in Manila to Leyte Island, where General Douglas A. MacArthur launched the liberation of the Philippines in 1944, to inaugurate a community irrigation project.

Before the day ended, he pushed an automobile out of a muddy road, chatted with Philippine farmers and ate an exotic dish made from pork, curdled hog's blood and the entrails of cows and water buffaloes.

He washed it down with Philippine beer and tropical fruits.  
Before he joined U.S. Government service, Ingersoll was an executive in the Borg-Warner corporation, a large American industrial firm.

He was one of several men recruited by President Kennedy's administration from industry and labor for service in the Agency for International Development (AID), which runs American aid spending overseas.

In several nations, including the Philippines, the U.S. Government is shifting much of its direct grant assistance to a program of loans repayable to the United States by the recipient nation.

**Marriages In U.S. Up Three Per Cent**

Washington - (UPI) - The Population Reference Bureau, Inc. estimates marriages in the United States in 1962 totaled 1.6 million, a three per cent increase over 1961. Almost two fifths of the brides and one eighth of the bridegrooms were in their teens.

Even more startling, said the bureau, over 50 per cent of today's teen-age wives become mothers while still in their teens. One of every six teen-age wives has two or more children.

Louisville, Ky. - (UPI) - Cooling capacity equivalent to about 400 room air conditioners is built into a \$400,000 tube testing machine built by Votator Division of Chemtron Corporation.

To remove the intense heat thrown out by powerful high-frequency electron tubes being tested for uses such as overseas broadcast transmission, satellite communications and missile warning systems, the unit takes in and constantly recirculates as much as 108 gallons of water a minute.
