New Adventures in Food Foretold by Grocer

New York - Breakfast on a tray may soon be standard procedure in the average American household. According to Paul S. Willis, president of Grocery Manufacturers of America, Inc., this is just one of the exciting new adventures in eating now on the way to homemakers from U. S. food manufacturers.

"Our food manufacturers," said Mr. Willis, "are convinced that tomorrow's progress comes out of today's research therefore, they are continuing to invest \$125 million annually in search of new products and product improvement. They fully realize that these products must have attractive appearance, good flavor and nutrition, and built-in time savers."

Frozen breakfasts on a disposable tray, although not on the market as yet, are being researched by technologists in food company laboratories and are indicative of the many kinds of new convenience foods which soon will be found in super markets.

For instance, watch for meat tenderizer in a spray container, liquid cake batter in a carton, round "push-up" tubes of butter, chocolate syrup in a plastic squeeze bottle with a snip-off cap, a greater variety of instant sauces and gravies, such as chili, white cream, hollandaise, barbecue and pizza, frozen baby carrots, and
