

Trial Date Set For Mail Fraud

Portland - (UP) - Seven men have been released on their own recognizance after pleading innocent to mail fraud charges stemming from an Oregon land development project.

The men were indicted by a federal grand jury May 31. They entered pleas Thursday and trial was set for Oct. 15 in U.S. District Court.

The defendants are Richard D. Walker, Los Angeles; George E. Isaacs, Glendale, Calif.; Maurice A. Hall, Beverly Hills, Calif.; Abraham Koolish, Winnetka, Ill.; David F. Koolish, Winnetka, Ill.; John M. Phillips, Evanston, Ill.; and Jack Cherbo, Chicago.

The indictment charged them with using deceptive literature depicting lakes, mountains and water sports activities to sell 7,000 acres of desert land in the Lake Valley area of Harney county.

The sale price was \$395 an acre. Justice Department officials and local authorities estimated the land's value at \$20 an acre.

Federal Judge Gus J. Solomon granted the seven 20 days in which to file motions in the case and gave them permission to return to their home states.

Ashland - Rough blocking rehearsals are under way at the Oregon Shakespearean festival in Ashland, with all four productions now in their second round of rehearsals.

Casts and directors met for the first time Monday afternoon, following Monday morning's announcement of casting for the four Shakespearean shows.

First on the preparation agenda was discussion and read-through of "Merry Wives of Windsor," the opening show in the 1963 Festival season. It was followed by the initial rehearsal of "Romeo and Juliet" on Monday evening, "Love's Labour's Lost" on Tuesday afternoon, and "Henry the Fifth" on Tuesday evening. The four shows will rehearse in this order until early July, when technical rehearsals begin. At that time, shows that have been rehearsing afternoons will trade schedules with the evening-rehearsing shows to facilitate lighting and technical installations.

As in the past, all festival rehearsals are open to the public until the beginning of technical and dress rehearsals.

General Manager William Patton reports that good seats are available for nearly all performances in the 1963 season. Opening night, July 24, has been sold out, however. Local patrons are encouraged to take advantage of the period July 24 to August 4 when orders are usually lightest.

Wirtz Determined To Block Strike

Washington - (UP) - Labor Secretary W. Willard Wirtz called rail union and management negotiators to his office today in a determined bid to block a nationwide railroad shutdown that could begin in five days.

Wirtz was expected to warn both sides that they were inviting a government-imposed solution of the three-year-old dispute over work rules unless they reached an agreement before a Monday midnight deadline.
