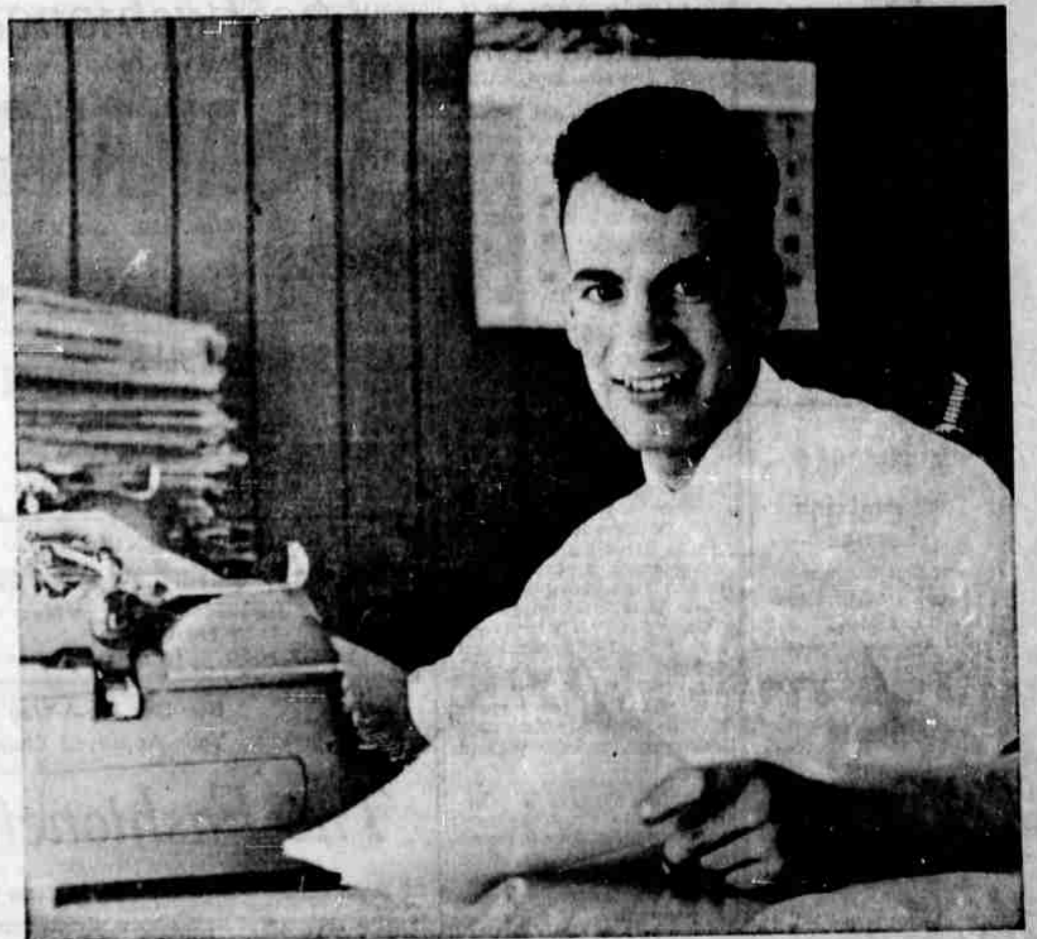
### Firms Hire Many Students
