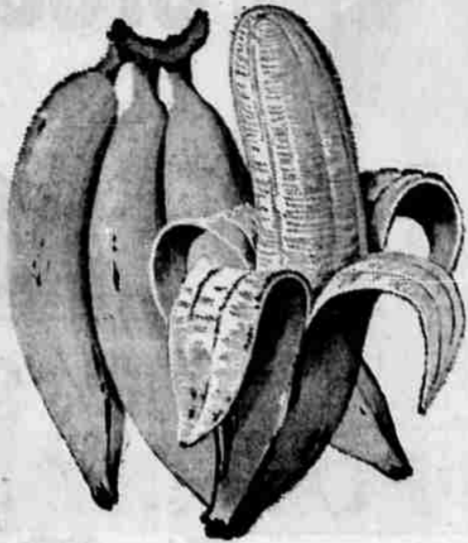

**Oregon State Is Granted \$425,000 For Hall Addition**

Corvallis-Oregon State university has been granted \$425,000 by the National Science Foundation to apply toward construction of a \$2,535,000 addition to the biological sciences building, Cordley hall.

Construction must await a May, 1964, election at which voters will be asked to approve a bond measure that would permit the state system of higher education to build \$12,500,000 worth of needed buildings.

Almost all of the new Cordley hall addition at OSU would be used by the department of zoology, President James H. Jensen said. Some space would be used for research by the departments of botany and entomology.

National Science Foundation grants to institutes that have major instruction and research programs in science and that need additional teaching and research facilities.

**Now Largest School**

The school of science is now the largest school on the OSU campus and one of the largest in the west, Jensen said. Science classrooms, laboratories and research facilities are needed to keep pace with rapid growth of the university, he added.

About 1,600 of the 10,000 students on campus last year took a class in zoology. Department enrollments have nearly tripled during the past 10 years and continued gains are seen for the future.

About 50 students are now working for advanced degrees in zoology. Night laboratories and classes are held every day in zoology because of overcrowded conditions, Dr. E. J. Dornfeld, department chairman, said.

The research program in zoology is also expanding rapidly, he added. Staff members hold research grants from the National Institutes of Health, National Science Foundation, American Cancer Society and various other agencies.

**\$4,000 Approved for Greenhouse Project**

The Jackson county court yesterday approved allocation of \$4,000 of the county budget for the new fiscal year for construction of a new greenhouse at Southern Oregon Branch Experiment station.

The county budget committee had referred the question back to the county court for its authorization.

Porter Lombard, station superintendent, said the estimated cost is \$3,500. The money will come from the annual \$4,000 agronomy station operating fund.

The greenhouse will be used for such research involving plant diseases, pear decline and biological control of insect pests, Lombard noted.

**Traveling Parents Are Given Advice**

Chicago-(UPI)-On long vacation trips with the children stop at least every two hours and let the children run a minute or two, the American Academy of Pediatrics suggests.

The academy also nixed the idea of trying to make an easy "500 miles a day" during an auto trip with children. "Three hundred to 350 miles a day is sufficient," the academy explained.
