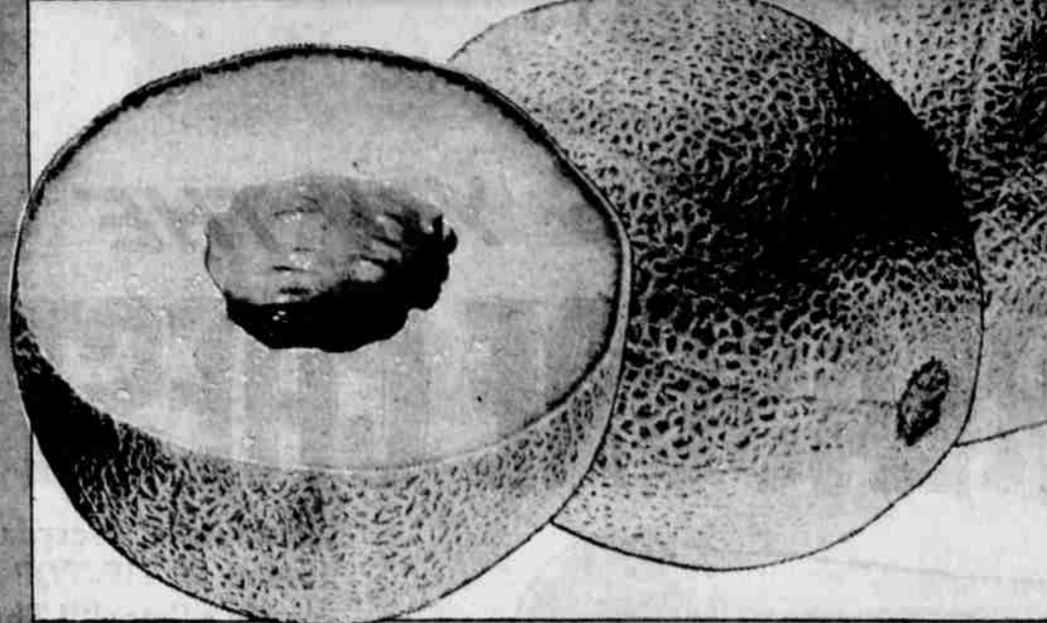

Fox Free Fleas in Water: Is This Fact or Just Fable?

Now that he was retired he was suffering the big let down; time dragged, the days were long and the nights were longer. A friend suggested a cure. "Why not spend some time in careful observation of the little creatures" that inhabited an uncleaned area near his home.

The man tried it. After a few weeks he became so interested in this new vocation there hardly seemed time enough to enjoy this entirely new field of wonders that had opened up before him. During the course of time, he made some remarkable discoveries. He also ran headlong into that peculiar area that exists between superstition and actual, scientific fact. He was to have trouble sorting it all out.

Fox Approached
