Flooding of Engine Room Blamed for Thresher Tragedy

Washington - The submarine Thresher, which went to the ocean bottom April 10 with 129 men aboard, probably lost nuclear power at a crucial moment when water was flooding its engine room.

Kennedy's National Service Corps efforts, later told United Press International that the full speed applied to the Nautilus increased the "lift" of its control surfaces enough to overcome the weight of flooding water.

The reactor apparently shut down automatically, as nuclear power plants are designed to do in certain emergencies, under a "fail-safe" system.

Anderson was operating "quite deep" in an anti-submarine exercise off the Maine coast when a cooling line broke and dumped water into the engine room "a ton every few seconds."

Presumably no one will ever know. There was no suggestion one way or the other in an official Navy report Thursday on the disaster, the worst ever to befall a submarine. The Navy said the "most probable" cause of the tragedy was flooding in the engine room caused by a piping system failure.
