601-Pound Matman Due Here Thursday

Haystack Calhoun, who at 601 pounds is the world's biggest wrestler, will make his only southern Oregon appearance this season at Medford armory next Thursday night.

Calhoun will be the seventh man in a seven-man battle royal which will introduce three other heavyweight matmen to local fans. They are Ivan "Killer" Kameroff, Abe Jacobs and Judo Jack Terry. Calhoun owns a farm in Arkansas, is married and the father of a small daughter. He is said to be surprisingly agile for a big man and has a good knowledge of wrestling. His specialty is the "belly flop" which he applies with a swan dive onto a fallen opponent.

He is the greatest drawing card on the national wrestling circuit and recently attracted a \$60,000 gate in Madison Square Garden in New York. The big fellow has been greeted by turn-away crowds in every appearance since coming to the northwest and promoter Elton Owen advises fans to be on hand early to be assured of a good seat.

Others in the big battle royal are Soldat Garky, Catalina George Drake and Andre Drappe. In the battle royal a man must be thrown, pushed or rolled over the top rope in order to be eliminated. Regular pins inside the ring will not count.

Owen has scheduled three preliminary matches with Gorky meeting Drappe in the feature match, for two out of three falls or 30 minutes. Other bouts will send Jacobs against Terry and Drake meeting Kameroff, both for one fall or 20 minutes. Reserved seat tickets are on sale at Lampert's Sporting Goods store in Medford. There will be no increase in prices, Owen said.

Homer Spoils Early Wynn's Bid for 300th

Cleveland—UPI—Early Wynn is still standing outside the exclusive club 300 but his knock is getting louder.

Wynn made another unsuccessful attempt Friday night—his fourth—to become the 14th major league pitcher to win 300 games. But he came close.

The 43-year-old right-hander hurled eight scoreless innings against the Chicago White Sox, his former team-mates, but lost 2-0 when Ron Hansen belted a two-run homer in the ninth.

Wynn, disappointed but not discouraged, said he expects to have even more going for him the next time out.

Good Stuff
"I felt I had good stuff tonight but I'm really not in shape yet," Wynn said. "I've come along faster than I expected but it will take a few more weeks before I get in the shape I want to be in."

Wynn, who threw a lively fast ball and a sharp curve, expects to be ready for another try "in about four or five days."

He may pitch in Chicago next week end and that's fine with him.

"I guess it's pride or something but I'd like to win number 300 against the White Sox."

Wynn, who helped Chicago to the pennant in 1959, was cut loose by the Sox after the end of last season after falling three times to gain the milestone victory.

Yang Will Not Be in Decathlon

Corvallis—UPI—C. K. Yang, the world decathlon record holder from Nationalist China and UCLA, does not plan to compete in the national AAU decathlon championships June 28-29, officials learned today.

Yang plans to pass up the event to make a European tour which was arranged by his government, according to word sent by Ducky Drake, UCLA coach. Yang also recently has been bothered by a torn rib cartilage.

Hayes Runs 100 In Record 9.1 Time

St. Louis—UPI—Boy Hayes, Florida A and M, ran a world record shattering 9.1 100-yard dash Friday as seven final events were completed in the 75th annual National AAU Track and Field championships here.

Hayes, who plays football almost as well as he runs, is a halfback on his school's team and has by-passed a possible gridiron career to concentrate on the 1964 Olympics.

The Friday competition saw Brian Sternberg, world record holder in the pole vault, shatter a meet record by clearing the bar at 16 feet 4 inches, four inches shorter than his world mark.

Hayes Jones, the Detroit school teacher, regained his 120-yard high hurdles title by equalling the meet record of 0:13.4. This was his fourth national AAU crown, having

won in 1958, 1960 and 1961. Pete McArdle, second last year, won the six-mile run in 28:29.2.

The 33-year-old bus mechanic from New York City is the Pan-American games 10,000-meter champion.

Dave Davis of the U. S. Marines dethroned defender Gary Gubner of the Grand Street Boys club, New York, in the shot put with a toss of 62 feet 5 3/4 inches. Gubner, who gets married Sunday in New York, had to settle for third at 60 feet 5 3/4 inches while Parry O'Brien, once the kingpin of the event, was runner-up with 62 feet 1 3/4 inches.

Larry Stuart of the Southern California Striders won the javelin with a throw of 255 feet 3 inches and teammate Ralph Boston made it three in a row in the broad-jump with a leap of 26 feet 10 inches.

Palmer, Boros Tie Cupit In U.S. Open

Brookline, Mass.—UPI—Arnold Palmer and Julius Boros, making a late charge with tournament-toughened nerves, collared young Jacky Cupit on the last two holes Saturday for a three-way tie in the U.S. Open Golf championship.

The 25-year-old Cupit started the final 18-holes at windswept country club of Brookline with a one shot lead over Palmer and three strokes on Boros.

But nerves steadied by the grind of years of competition made the difference as Boros, the Open champion in 1952, and Palmer, the winner in 1950, collared him in the final few holes to send it into a three-way tie and a playoff.

Boros waded through this at 2 p.m. EDT Sunday.

Stable Decisions Scott

New York—UPI—Stocky Jose Stable, Cuban New Yorker, used a buzz-saw hooking attack to win a unanimous decision over Ranger Charley Scott of Philadelphia Saturday night and earn a probable non-title fight with welterweight champion Emile Griffith.

Stable had the better of the hard-fighting because of his close-quarter hammering in their nationally televised 10-rounder at Madison Square Garden.

There were no knockdowns but each was shaken several times and Stable's right brow was slightly cut as was the inside of Scott's upper lip. Scott's right eye was badly bruised in the terrific 10th round.
