Paula Lowery claimed the district laurels for the 16 and under girls' open division, A. T. Highland qualified for state as the only entry in the 16 and under boys' open district bracket.

Enyart struck out batters on eight occasions and issued two free passes in the counter. Bob Woldt was credited with the lone hit against him in the fifth inning. The Medford book called shortstop Dan Miles throw into the dirt at first base an error.

Roseburg surged to nab the opener 4 to 3 and Central Point won the second hassle 1 to 0 in non-league American Legion junior games.

The Lockwood club erased a 1 to 3 deficit with its big seventh on hits by Jim Beamer and Lance Casebeer, two bases on balls, two hit batters and a wild pitch. Studs' second relief hurler Neal Ellis hit Artie McDonald with a pitch with the bases loaded to send across what proved to be the winning run.
