Ellen S. — He should hold out for an administrative niche even if the pay is low, go and we're forced to accept...

Richard S. — It's like dropping from boss to office-boy!

Ellen S. — When an executive of 55 loses his job, it's a real catastrophe. When the shipping company of which my husband was vice-president was absorbed by a big firm, he and a dozen others were let out. That was six months ago and we're forced to accept help from his brother. I wish he'd stop waiting for another vice-presidency and take the modest job he's been offered.

Richard S. — That offer Ellen harps on is to sit at one of 100 desks and process mail orders. Aside from what it would do with what's left of my ego, we couldn't live on the pay—about 25 per cent of my former salary. I'd still need help from my brother—and he agrees that I should

The Councils Take the job, Richard. Even though your brother doesn't mind helping out, he must realize that it's more blessed—and easier—to give than to receive. It's been doubly hard for you to be on the less blessed end, for obviously you've always been in command. We venture to say that be it ever so humble, the desk job will be your steppingstone to a "featured role" in industry again, once an executive, always an executive-type. While those around you go through their 8-to-5 motions, you'll see new possibilities, short-cuts, angles to expedite the paperwork, and before long you're bound to be a supervisor, with a decent boost in salary. Meanwhile, Ellen, if you can pick up a paycheck as a saleswoman or receptionist, the days of feeling beholden to your brother-in-law may end soon. By lowering his sights and adjusting his budget, Richard can accept a humdrum post and transform it quietly into a satisfying challenge. Incidentally, there's a non-profit agency which for 24 years has been placing ex-executives like Richard. It's called "Forty Plus" and the New York City office is at 15 Park Row.

(Editor's Note: Following is an open letter to residents of the Butte Falls school district from Charles Copeland, who resigned as district superintendent last week. His resignation was the latest development in a controversy touched off by a school board decision last March not to rehire C. L. Stratton, principal of the Butte Falls Elementary school.)

Having submitted to the board of education my resignation, effective prior to the beginning of the next school year, I would like to take this opportunity to report to the patrons of the school district.

I feel that important progress has been made during the past year in the development of a strong educational program for the Butte Falls schools. Perhaps the most notable accomplishment has been the development of the six-year high school, through the cooperation of the local board of education, the county school office and the state department of education.

This plan of organization will make possible the addition of several new courses to the high school curriculum

and will permit teachers to confine themselves to areas in which they are prepared to teach.

Members Commended
The school board members are to be commended for their willingness to work in the interest of the school program.

Democrats Ponder Convention Site

Washington—UPI—Democratic national committeemen gathered Monday to select a site for the party's 1964 convention, with Atlantic City the most likely choice.

Chicago and San Francisco still were in the running, however.

San Francisco already has won the Republican convention. The GOP National Committee announced Saturday the nominating conclaves would open in the Cow Palace in San Francisco on July 13, 1964.

The Democrats are expected to convene their convention much later, probably in mid-August, because President Kennedy is assured of nomination and they don't face the GOP problem of having to build up a candidate.

They have taken time to travel at their own expense to observe programs being offered by other schools and to meet with county and state educators in an effort to solve the school district's problems. I have enjoyed working with the people of Butte Falls and appreciate the support which I have received. You have in Butte Falls a potentially excellent school system. Your children are eager to learn and the teachers are capable and dedicated.

However, the support of every parent and patron is an absolute essential if quality education is to be accomplished. It is in the interest of securing this kind of unity and support that I have, after careful consideration, determined to resign as district superintendent. I feel that the actions taken by the board of education have been taken after proper deliberation and that they have been in the best interest of the school district.

I encourage you to secure a competent administrator, respect his judgment in educational matters, unite in support of the schools and give your children the quality education to which they are entitled.

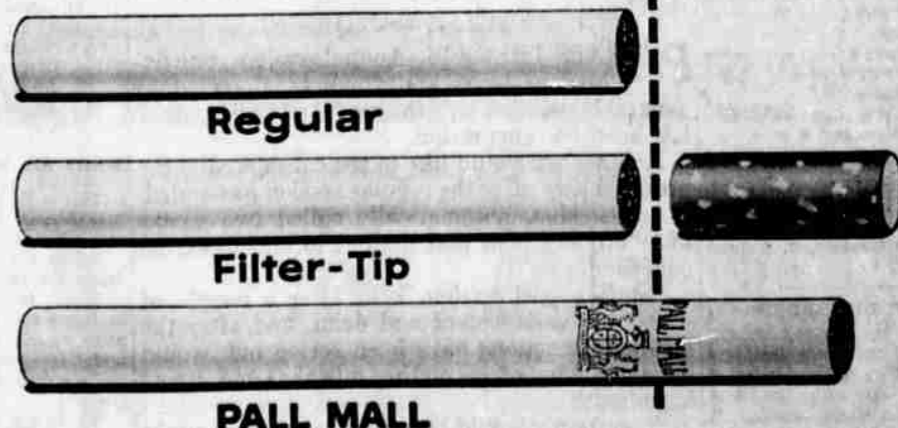
