

Sports Area Will Have Summer Use

Ashland - The Mt. Ashland winter sports area will have good potential for summer use as well, Alex Murphy, manager of the Mt. Ashland Corp. told members of the Ashland Chamber of Commerce Tuesday.

Speaking at the final chamber luncheon before its annual summer break during July and August, Murphy told of progress being made in development of the area.

It is anticipated that a fine restaurant will be established at the ski lodge, he said, one that will lure visitors throughout the year.

The view from Mt. Ashland should also be an attraction for visitors in the summer as well as at other times of the year, he added, noting that sunsets are especially beautiful from that vantage point.

Work is now under way on clearing area for the T-bar and trainer lifts for skiers. Work on construction of the lodge is expected to start between July 10 and 15.

At some later date, a chair lift will be built to the peak of the mountain, he said.

Murphy called the location of the Mt. Ashland ski area "excellent" because it has a larger adjacent population than most other ski areas in the country.

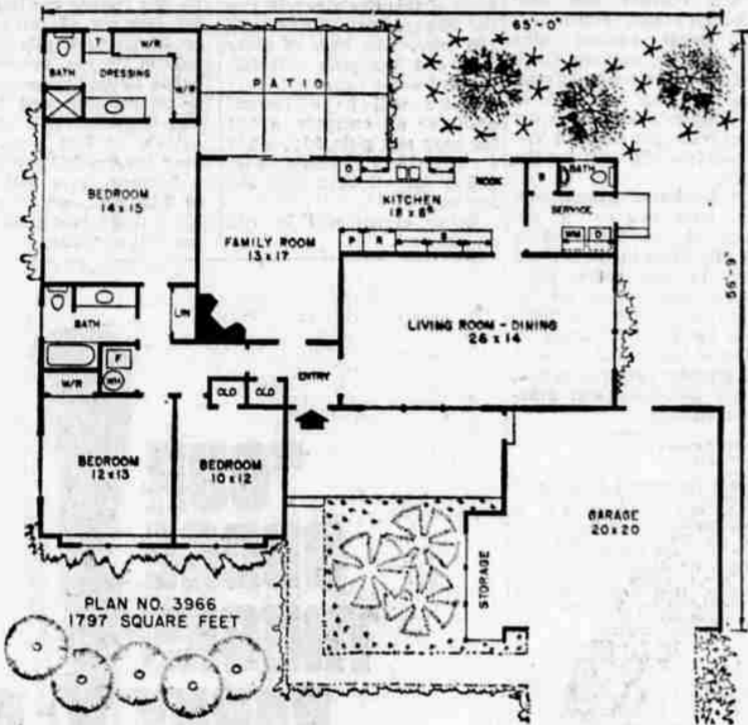
He foresaw great potential in "developing the present non-skier."

This Week's Plan for Home Builders

One of the outstanding joys of a well-planned home, for privacy conscious parents, is to be able to retire to the living room and there to luxuriate in entertaining - or a good book - in peace and quiet.

A good "dead-end" living room is literally that as it has no cross traffic to or from other areas of the house. Obviously not all plans can be arranged in such a manner to provide this but here is one that has been.

Placed in Closet
Another feature of this living room is that the dining area of the room is the same width as the living room, which eliminates the wall offset formed by the usual dining-ell. Although a fireplace has not been located in this room, one could be built here during the construction of the home, if desired.

The furnace and water heater have been placed in a

closet next to the bath. If preferred, these utilities could be relocated in the garage which will provide an extra storage closet in the house.

The master bedroom suite is separated from the children's rooms by the family bath. Both this room and one of the children's bedrooms has a shoulder high sliding window in one wall which provides cross ventilation but does not interfere with furniture arrangement. A wide pullman lavatory plus a dressing table is a feature of the dressing room. The shower and water closet are in a separate compartment. This arrangement offers more privacy.

Convenient to Kitchen

The family room is convenient to the kitchen, front door and sliding glass doors open from this room to the rear patio. Open planning has been achieved by eliminating the wall between the kitchen and family rooms. This arrangement creates easier traffic flow between the rooms and helps each area appear larger than its actual size. The doors leading from the kitchen to the service and dining areas have been arranged so as to provide a maximum amount of space in the nook.

An access door opens from the garage to the covered front porch while another opens to a walk which leads to the service door.

The rustic ranch exterior has been achieved by using several different materials that not only weather well but which will blend into any verdant landscape.
