Kidneys Helped By Surgery

Recently, when I visited those great artery surgeons, Drs. Michael E. DeBakey and Denton A. Cooley in Houston, Texas, they showed me how they are saving the lives of a few patients with high blood pressure—who suddenly start to have serious trouble due to failure of their kidneys to function well.

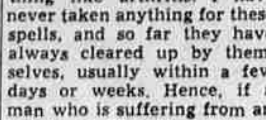
Ordinarily this kidney failure, with the backing-up into the blood of chemicals which ought to be leaving the body by way of the urine, soon leads to death. Lately, it has been found that in some of these cases, a dangerous flare-up in high blood pressure has come because of a narrowing in the artery that supplies a kidney with blood. This has caused the function of the kidney to fail.

Although these seriously ill patients are very poor surgical risks, Dr. DeBakey and his group have operated on eight of them and have given them great relief. The operation lowered the high blood pressure. Today these persons—who in the old days would have been doomed—are back at work. I am writing this to show how medicine keeps moving forward spectacularly.
