

Card Transmission Terminal in Use at University Center

Eugene - A new IBM card transmission terminal, installed at the University of Oregon's statistical laboratory and computing center, can transmit data over telephone line to and from UCLA or Oregon State university in a matter of minutes.

Called an IBM 1013 Card Transmission Terminal, the machine can transmit data from up to 140 cards per minute. It will allow communication with any institution which has similar apparatus. The University of Oregon and Oregon State university have the only such card transmitters in the state.

Principal Usefulness

The principal usefulness of the machine will be in communicating with the Western Data Processing Center in Los Angeles, which has a large computer available to member institutions.

The transmitter will allow University of Oregon personnel to make use of the large computer as fast and conveniently as do persons in Los Angeles.

Communications takes place something like this: By using a special telephone near the transmitter, one may call the Western Data Processing Center (or wherever information is desired); after vocal communication is reached, IBM cards are placed into the transmitter. The information on the cards is recorded on a magnetic tape, sent over telephone wires to Los Angeles, run through the large computer there and sent back the same way. Finally, the new data is shown on punched IBM cards.

In the past, data to and from institutions had to be sent by mail. This means packing IBM cards for mailing, getting them to the post office, and trusting that the other institution would return the

needed data before too long. Although the communication process will be greatly simplified, the machine itself is complex - it was partially designed and wired by a computer and even the repair manual contains diagrams made by a computer.

The statistical laboratory and computing center, established in 1960, is located in Deady hall. The center conducts research in the development of new statistical, numerical and computational procedures and provides a consulting service in the fields of statistical and numerical analysis and computing.

IRS Confiscates Works of Artist

Sacramento, Calif. - (UPI) - The Internal Revenue Service has gone into the art business.

In an "amicable" settlement, it confiscated 15 paintings of well-known artist Donald F. Reich from galleries at Oak Park and Folsom and from Reich himself.

"They were the only assets he had," said an IRS spokesman Wednesday. "As far as we know, this has no precedent in this region."

Then, with an eye on Reich's \$1,216 tax bill, it promptly put the paintings on display in a local bank "to get bidders interested."

The IRS said it will sell the

paintings, on a sealed bid basis, in the fall.

"That's when you get the best price," the IRS spokesman said.

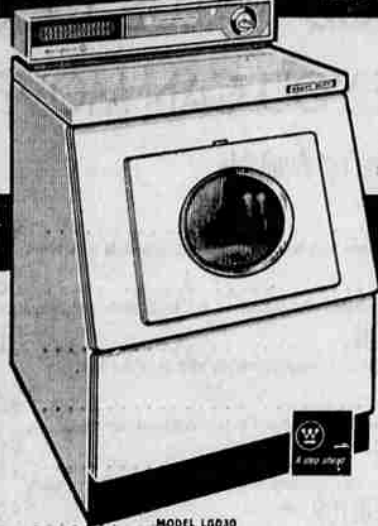

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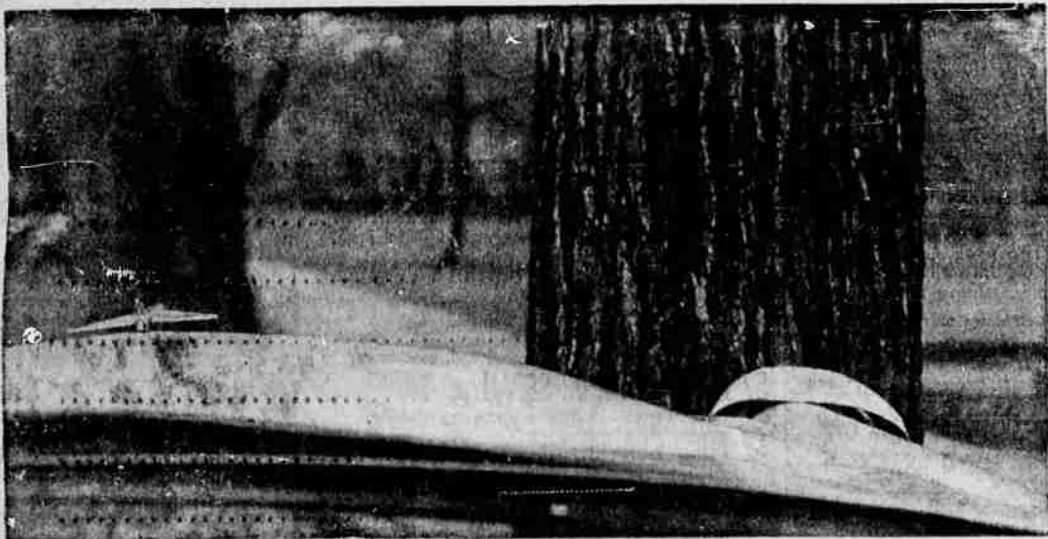
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Committees Named For Demo Picnic

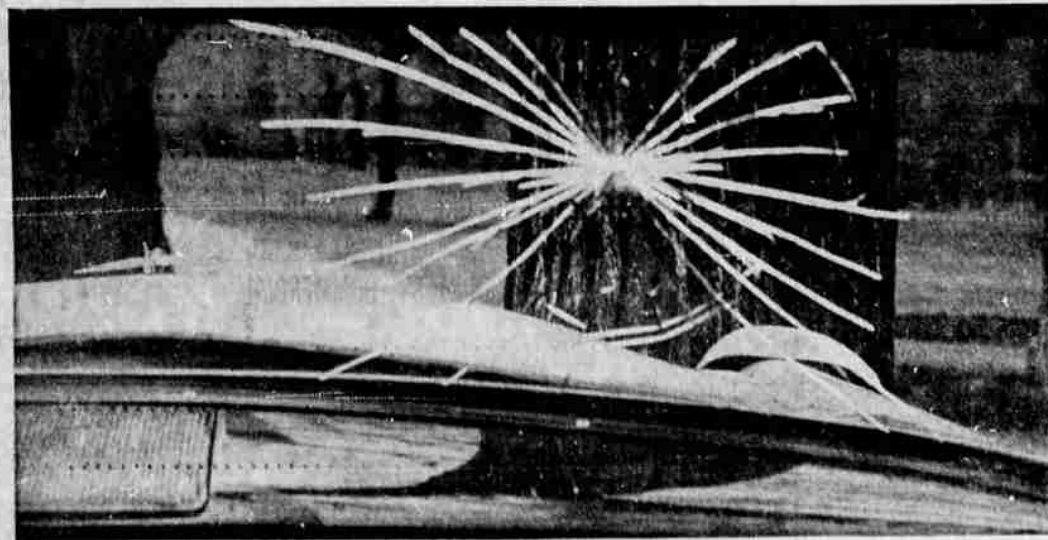
The Jackson County Democratic Central committee voted this week to refer to its executive committee a proposal to hold a County Platform convention in February, 1964.
