Howard Homers as Bums Beat Braves; Mets Lose

By United Press International Lefthanded relief star Ron Perranoski notched his 10th win of the year Saturday when Frank Howard's bases-empty home run in the eighth inning, his third in less than 24 hours, gave the first-place Los Angeles Dodgers a 5-4 victory over the Milwaukee Braves.

second on Joe Torre's single and scored on another single by Gene Oliver. Koufax put the Dodgers ahead 3-0 in the fifth with a three run homer off starter Denver Lemaster. It was only the second home run for Koufax in his major league career. He got his other one against the Braves at Milwaukee last year.

The Phillies jumped on New York starter Al Jackson for all of their runs in the first two innings and Dallas Green took it from there to record his third victory of the season. Duke Snider's 13th homer of the year, in the sixth, prevented a shutout.

Perranoski, making his 37th relief appearance of the season, came on with one out in the sixth in relief of starter Sandy Koufax, who was shooting for his 17th victory. Perranoski gave up one run on three hits in finishing the game.

Lee Wall's sixth inning double scored Howard, who had singled, and gave Los Angeles a 4-1 lead. Oliver's 10th homer of the year and his fourth as a Brave gave Milwaukee its first run in the fourth. The Braves drove Koufax from the game in their two-run sixth.

Boxer Dies From Drug Overdose

New York - (UP) - Billy Bello, 20-year-old New York welterweight boxer who made his national debut at Madison Square Garden two weeks ago, was found dead Saturday from an apparent overdose of narcotics.

Bello, well regarded even though he lost his first big main event bout to Gaspar Ortega of Mexico on July 6, was lying in a Bronx hallway at about 2:30 a.m. when found by tenants in the building.

Dr. Sanford Edberg, an assistant medical examiner, announced the preliminary finding as to cause of death. He said that Bello's left forearm bore the telltale perforation marks of an addict.

An autopsy on the body will be performed today at the Jacoby hospital where Bello was taken.

Bello had won 17 fights, lost five and fought one draw when he got his big chance against Ortega. It was a brawling scrap in which Ortega eked out a split decision. Bello lived with his mother not too far from the death scene. When police answered the call of a tenant around noon Saturday they found Bello on the floor in the hallway on the fifth landing. He was lying on his right side with his right arm extended above his head.

Another tenant had discovered the body some 10 hours earlier but he dismissed Bello for a drunk and went about his business.

Liston, Patterson Fight Expected To Be Sellout

Las Vegas, Nev. - (UP) - Promoter Al Bolan announced Saturday there will be a "complete sellout" of all 7,691 paid seats Monday night for the Sonny Liston-Floyd Patterson heavyweight title fight at the Convention Center.

He said the gross gate for this return 15-round fight should approach \$300,000 and set a new Nevada record for fights.

Both champion Sonny Liston, 30, and ex-champ Patterson, 28, were scheduled for their final news conferences Saturday.

Big Sonny, who won the title from Floyd on a first-round knockout at Chicago last Sept. 25, planned to take a brief workout Saturday at the Thunderbird Hotel before his conference.

Because Sonny was so destructive at 214 pounds in Chicago, he plans to scale about the same at Saturday's weigh-in.

Patterson, who has finished his public workouts, planned to talk to the writers Saturday and then disappear until the weigh-in. Floyd hopes to register about 195 pounds, six more than at Chicago.

The Nevada State Athletic Commission announced late Friday that the safety rule providing a knockout defeat for any fighter floored three times in one round would be waived for this fight.

But the commission also announced that the safety rule requiring an eight-count for a floored boxer before he can continue will be enforced.

As champion Sonny tapered off training Saturday, he disclosed he had slipped a condenser Cassius Clay's face in the Thunderbird Hotel's game room on Thursday when Cassius called Sonny "a chump-not a champ."

Liston said: "He didn't try to slap back. He just grabbed the edge of a crap table to keep from falling down."

If Sonny beats Floyd Monday night, Sonny will make his next defense against Clay at Philadelphia's Municipal Stadium Sept. 30.

Tournament officials said the championship probably would give Osborne a berth on the Junior Davis Cup team. The team will be selected at a later date.

Homers Help Ford Notch 15th Win, Top Indians 5-4

By United Press International Reliever Hal Reniff choked off a ninth-inning rally by the Cleveland Indians to nail down a 5-4 victory for the New York Yankees Saturday and preserve Whitey Fords 15th triumph of the season.

The victory was the 11th straight for Ford, who has lost only three games this season. He had pitched scoreless ball against the Indians for 20 1-3 consecutive innings before Alvis connected for his 12th homer in the fourth with the bases empty.

In night games, Baltimore was at Kansas City and Detroit at Los Angeles.

Two-run homers by Joe Peppone and Harry Bright off Cleveland starter Dick Donovan provided the Yankees with their winning margin.

The defeat was the seventh in a row for the fading Indians, who were limited to one run and three hits by Ford until the ninth.

First Walk Willie Tasby strated a three-run rally when he drew Ford's first walk of the game and Willie Kirkland singled, Rookie Max Alvis tripled to drive them both home.

Reniff took over at this point and yielded a run-producing single to pinch-hitter Fred Whitfield and although John Romano also singled, Reniff ended the game by inducing pinch-hitter Al Luplow to bounce into a double play.

Shutout Victory Gary Peters of the White Sox pitched a seven-hitter for his second consecutive shutout victory and Rookie Pete Ward and Mike Hershberger each hit a homer to sink the Red Sox. Ward's homer followed a double by Nellie Fox.

Don Mincher hit two home runs and Bernie Allen hit one for Minnesota. Don Lock, Chuck Hinton and Don Zimmer hit Washington homers. Dick Stigman held the Senators to seven hits and evened his season record at 9-9. Steve Ridzik was the loser.
