ORDINANCE NO. 8573 AN ORDINANCE providing for the construction of paving 15th Street from Willamette Avenue to Ashland Avenue, in the City of Medford, Oregon, and for the assessment of the cost thereof on adjacent property, providing for a meeting of the Council to consider protests against said improvement and providing for the recording of the same.

THE CITY OF MEDFORD DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: SECTION 1. That it is the intention of the Council to cause the construction of paving 15th Street from Willamette Avenue to Ashland Avenue, in accordance with the attached and identified plans and specifications on file in the office of the City Manager at the City Hall, Medford, Oregon, to which reference is hereby made for details and estimated costs thereof, and to assess upon each lot, or part thereof, adjacent to and benefited by such improvement its proportionate share of the cost of said improvement as provided by the Charter of the City of Medford.

SECTION 2. That the Recorder-Treasurer is hereby directed to serve notice hereon upon the owners of the property located within the area shown on the attached and identified plans and specifications on file in the office of the City Manager at the City Hall on the 1st day of August, 1963, at 7:30 P.M., and to publish this ordinance once in each newspaper printed and published in the City of Medford, Oregon, and to post five copies of this ordinance in five public places within the City of Medford, Oregon, for a period of ten (10) days prior to said meeting.

SECTION 3. That the Council and signed by me in open session in authentication of its passage this 18th day of July, 1963.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at 7:30 o'clock P.M., on the 1st day of August, 1963, in the Council Chamber of the City Hall in the City of Medford, Oregon, there shall be public hearings by and before the Council of said City on the questions of amending Ordinance No. 8573 by changing the zoning of the following described areas within said City:

(1) Lots 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11, South Sea Extension, — Being located in the west side of 15th Street, north of Earhart Street, Medford, Oregon, from Class II, Multiple-Family, to Class IIIA, Commercial.

(2) That portion of the following described property lying within the city limits of Medford, Oregon, being that portion of the property, being that portion of 300 feet south of Barnett Road, beginning at an iron pipe on the south line of Barnett Road, said pipe being north 89° 09' 00" east 100.9 feet and east 89° 09' 00" from a 4" brass-capped monument set for the northeast corner of Donation Land Claim No. 45 in Township 37 south, Range 1 west of the Willamette Meridian in Jackson County, Oregon; and from said pipe, running thence along said road line, east 402.8 feet to an iron pipe, thence south 520.6 feet to an iron pipe, thence west 394.8 feet to an iron pipe, set at 323.3 feet; thence as follows: north 37° 00' east 160 feet; north 14° 04' west 343.9 feet; and north 30° 36' west 23.6 feet to the point of beginning.

Campgrounds Open In National Forest

The majority of the snow-free zone in the Rogue River National Forest with many campgrounds and trails reported open in the forest's weekly recreation report.

The McDonald Creek rd., in the Ashland ranger district is open for the first time in two years, it was reported.

The Dunlop, Old Baldy, Daley, Dead Indian Soda Springs and Wagner Butte trails are maintained, and all campgrounds are open.

In the Applegate district, all roads are open except Elliott creek and Yale creek with Glade Creek rd. barely passable, the forest service said.

Moderate logging traffic was reported on Carberry, Sturgis, Beaver creek, Middlefork, Snauw creek and heavy traffic on Thompson creek.

Campers are to check at the ranger station before planning to use Beaver, Silver or Cook and Green campgrounds.

Drifts of snow Scattered drifts of snow are reported in the Seven Lakes basin of the Butte Falls district with all low elevation trails open.

The district's roads are open but Blue Rock rd. is being surfaced. Motorists are cautioned to watch for heavy traffic on the Blue Rock and Lodgepole rds.

While all of the campgrounds are open, evenings are still cold and campers should take warm clothing.

All main roads and trails on the west side of the highway in the Prospect district are open. Heavy logging traffic on week days may be encountered on Woodruff Creek, Abbot creek and Woodruff access rds. Some of the higher elevation roads are still blocked due to blowdown timber.

Problem of Blowdown This problem with blowdown also is evident in the Union Creek district where some trails are open, but free travel may be hampered by the downed trees.

Logging traffic in this district is heaviest on the Prairie Creek, Crater Creek and Huckleberry Mountain rds. Lesser amounts of hauling are from Natural Bridge, the Church camp, and Woodruff Meadows.

South Union Creek campground will be closed all season for construction work. Foresters noted that the unseasonal cold weather has cut the average use of the campgrounds in this district.

Talent Resident Picked By Corps

Talent—Marnee C. Jones of Rt. 1, box 356, Talent, is one of two women from Oregon accepted for Turkish Peace Corps training at Portland State college this summer.

Miss Jones received her degree in home economics from Oregon State University in June.

There have been 36 volunteers accepted, according to Project Director Dr. John Dart. Miss Jones and Ann T. Weick of Portland were the only two from the Northwest.

A total of 52 applicants will begin an 11-week training program at Portland State College on August 19.

The Turkish government has requested 46 persons and extra volunteers will be trained, Dr. Dart said.

Deputies Return Man to Medford

Melvin Edwin Snodgrass, 25, was returned to Medford \$50,000 Recovered in Support Fraud Cases

Salem—During June the Welfare Recovery division of the State Department of Justice collected \$50,000 for child support and welfare fraud.

Child support collections amounted to \$49,383 and welfare fraud payments brought in an additional \$917.
