**WCA Review by CAB Requested**

Salem — (UPI) — Two state agencies have asked the Civil Aeronautics board to review its order which would have eliminated West Coast Airlines service in Salem, Lakeview and Burns. The petition to the CAB was sent by Public Utility Commissioner Jonel C. Hill and the State Board of Aeronautics.

The CAB order on West Coast's operations was scheduled to go into effect next week, but the petitions from the state agencies and several Oregon cities will delay its implementation.

The petition filed by the state agencies argues that the airline has never instituted a usable commuter service between Ontario, Baker, Pendleton and Portland.

It points out the order does not direct the airline to institute service between Boise, Idaho, and Portland with Burns, Bend and Salem as intermediate points.

It also questions the CAB's policy and discretion in recommending the deletion of Lakeview as a service point in light of inferior Lakeview-Portland service that has been offered and lack of service to Reno, Nev.

**Suspects Held In Idaho Killing**

Hagerman, Idaho — (UPI) — Deputy Sheriff Vern Roysse planned to question two suspects at Burley today about the roadside robbery - murder of a Portland, Ore., man near here Monday night.

Tuesday, Roysse ordered release of two suspects picked up at Boise. He said he was convinced they were not connected with the crime.

Meantime, officers awaited arrival in Gooding of George Owen, Portland, believed to be foreman of the victim. Officers tentatively have identified the dead man as Richard A. Herald, 31, Portland, but were awaiting Owen's arrival to make positive identification.

The victim was found Monday evening in a pickup at a roadside park about 2½ miles south of here on U.S. Highway 30. An autopsy disclosed he had been shot twice in the head with a .22 or .25 caliber weapon. The murder weapon was not found.

Roysse said he believed robbery was the motive for the crime. Officers found \$11 in the man's clothing but his wallet was missing.

**Five Small Fires Doused in Oregon**

Salem — (UPI) — Five small fires in Oregon forests were quickly brought under control Tuesday, the State Forestry Department reported today.

All were man-caused and the largest was confined to half an acre.

Three were in the Southeast Oregon district, where one was caused by a smoker and another by a train.

A careless smoker caused one Central Oregon district fire and the cause of one in the Northwest has not been identified.

Neither the U. S. Forest Service nor the Bureau of Land Management in Portland reported any major fires in the state this morning.

**BLM Appoints New Eugene Manager**

Portland — (UPI) — Joseph C. Dose, a member of the forestry staff at the Bureau of Land Management's Washington, D.C., office, has been appointed manager of the Eugene District.

The appointment was announced Tuesday by BLM State Director Russell E. Getty. Dose succeeds Lester Dunn, who becomes chief of the division of range and forest management for the BLM in California. The new director was a forester in the Coos Bay district in 1952 and later headed the forestry unit in that district.

**Benton Deputy Injured in Crash**

Corvallis — (UPI) — A Benton county deputy sheriff was injured Tuesday night when he crashed his car into a ditch to avoid hitting a car he was chasing.

Deputy Julian R. Horning, 32, Monroe, chased the speeding car south from Monroe, Sheriff C. E. Ream said. At Cheeshire the car turned toward Florence on Highway 36 and stopped in the middle of the highway with its lights out. As Horning rounded the turn, the brake lights on the stopped car suddenly flashed.

Horning swerved into the ditch and was knocked unconscious. The car he had been chasing then sped away.

Horning was brought by ambulance to a Corvallis hospital. His condition is not serious, Ream said.

**Tractor Accidents Claim Two Lives**

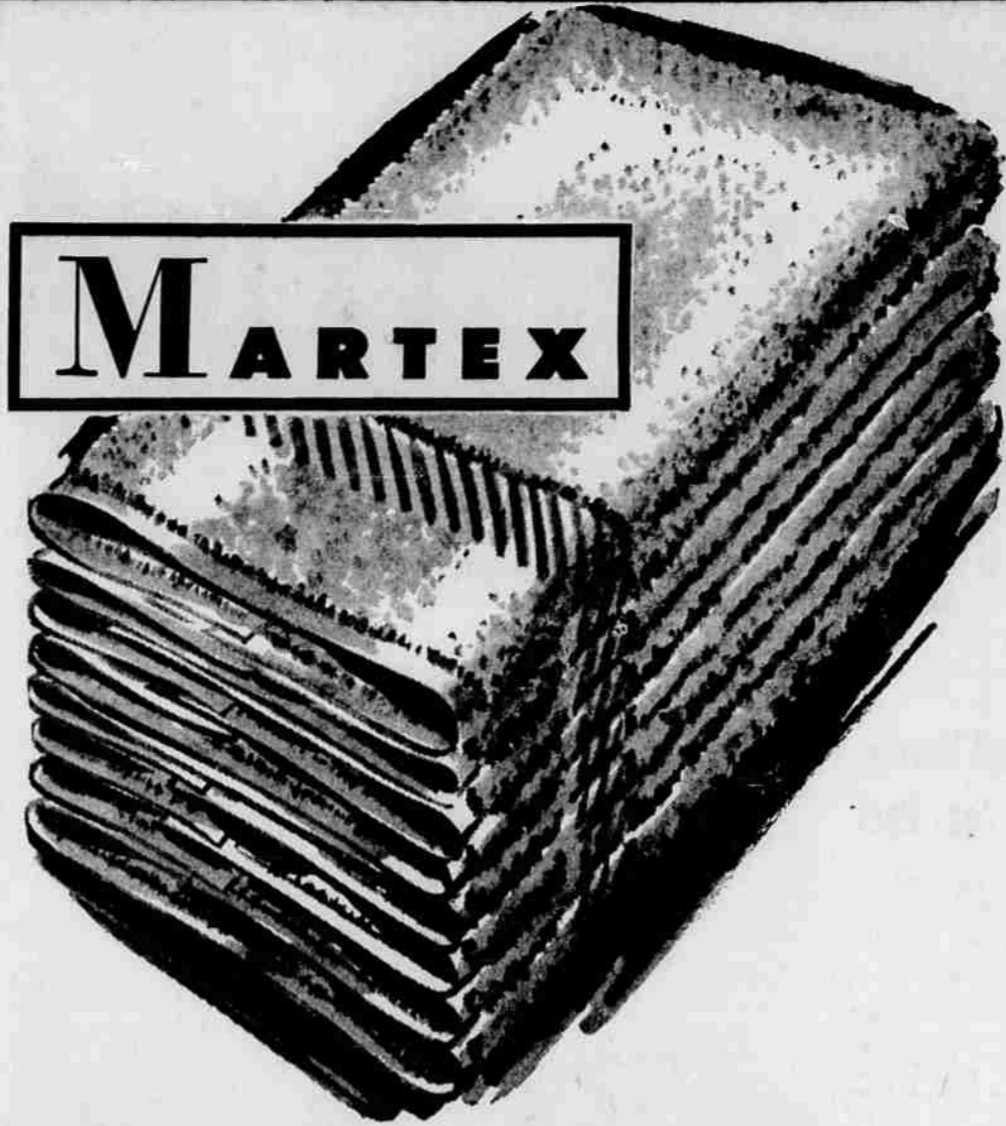
**LIGHTNING STRIKES**
