

British Critics Pan 'PT 109' Movie on Kennedy's Exploits

London—The "PT 109" movie about President Kennedy's World War II exploits, received a thorough panning from London movie critics today.

Headlines over the reviews ranged from "It's enough to make a President blush" to "Kennedy gets a ducking" to "Tarzan Kennedy beats the Japs and surrenders to clichés."

The Daily Express asked how a movie could be made about the heroism of a future President "without exaggerating the exploit and making the President look a damned fool."

"Kennedy emerges not as a damned fool but a terrible prig," the Express said. "Sitting through this film of his wartime exploits must surely have been his most blushing experience this year."

"Oh dear, poor President Kennedy has fallen into the water good and proper," said the Daily Herald. "It embodies all the worst features of the worst type of American war film, including great dollops of sentimental dialogue that are frankly laughable."

"Kennedy appears as one of those smug all-American servicemen who delivered reassuring little homilies to their battle-worn men in the intervals between facing up unflinchingly to the enemy," it said.

Air Force Head Defense Choice of General Dynamics

Washington—(UPI)—Air Force Secretary Eugene M. Zuckert Thursday defended the decision by Pentagon civilian chiefs to select General Dynamics Corp. for the disputed TEX fighter plane contract.

Zuckert told Senate investigators that the decision last November reflected the findings of a 250-member technical evaluation team composed of military and civilian experts.

It was Zuckert's first testimony before the Senate investigations subcommittee. It came after fresh charges were leveled against Navy Secretary Fred Korth in the TEX case.

In a politically explosive windup of earlier testimony by Korth, a senator implied by Navy secretary was influenced by outside interests, and a congressman demanded that Korth be fired immediately because of "clear conflict of interest" in a "Texas-sized scandal."

Zuckert, armed with a 98-page detailed statement, reiterated the Pentagon's stand that General Dynamics offered the best plane with the quickest delivery at the lowest cost.

The subcommittee, headed by Sen. John L. McClellan (D-Ark.) is investigating why the huge award went to the Fort Worth, Tex., General Dynamics plant—located in Korth's home town—despite preferences by high echelon military men for a rival Boeing Co. bid.

The contract for the changeable wing, bi-service, super-sonic fighter, one of the largest U. S. military procurements in history, is expected to exceed \$8.5 billion.

Zuckert's closed-door testimony was to be made public later.

Peace Corpsmen Said Disillusioned

Winston-Salem, N.C.—(UPI)—A former Peace Corps worker said Thursday that many Peace Corps members are becoming "frustrated and disillusioned" because they find many foreign governments "don't really want our help."

"They discourage us because they are afraid we'll acquire the masses with a better way of life," said Charles L. James, 27, "Autocrats can control a discontented intelligentsia but they wouldn't be able to control widespread unrest."

James said he developed an ulcer serving with the Peace Corps in Ethiopia where, he said, government officials keep a close watch on Americans "because we're the real revolutionaries."
