

Dedication Scheduled for First Christian Church

Dedication of the new First Christian church at 1900 Crater Lake ave. will be Sunday at 3 p.m.

Dr. Charles H. Addleman, Woodburn, past executive secretary of the Oregon Christian Missionary society, will give the dedicatory address.

Two former ministers will take part in the program: Dr. D. E. Millard, Eagle Point, who was the pastor from 1919 to 1922, and the Rev. E. M. Patterson, Turner, Ore., who ministered in 1902 in the original church at Sixth and Ivy sts. Mr. Patterson is the oldest living former pastor of the

church. The Rev. Delbert Troxel, formerly of Medford, missionary to Japan will also participate in the program. Mayor James J. Dunlevy will speak on behalf of the city.

Music for the dedication services will include a duet by David Harkness, the church architect, and Mrs. Harkness of Bakersfield, Calif. Mrs. Ralph Matlack will sing "Open the Gates of the Temple" and the combined choirs of the church will sing two anthems, "O Thou Whose Own Vast Temple Stands" and "Christ is Made the Sure Foundation." The Rev. Wendell Wagler directs the choirs and Gene Teeling is the organist.

Preside at Services

The Rev. Fredrick Ross Evans will preside at the dedication services. Following this there will be an open house and reception.

At the 9:30 a.m. services Dr. Ward Rice, Eugene, who was minister here in 1943, will give the sermon. The carillon choir will sing the spiritual "Lonesome Valley"

with an incidental solo by Miss Anne Bannister.

The Rev. William C. Piper, who retired July 1, was pastor here from 1954 to 1960. He will be the guest speaker at the 11 a.m. service. His sermon title is "What Makes Church Relevant?" The chancel choir will sing "When We Lift Our Eyes to Pray."

Gene Taylor will be presented his God and Country scouting award at the 9:30 a.m. service. Several people will be baptized at the 11 a.m. worship period.

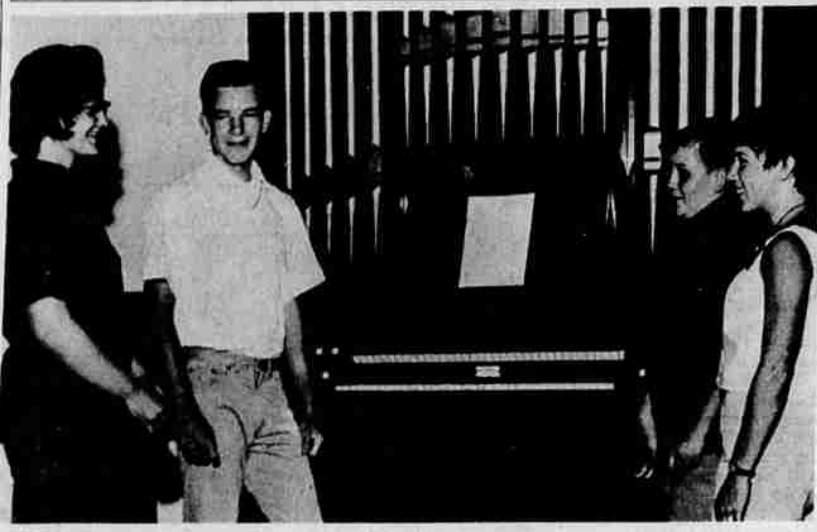
