Mrs. C. H. — Her boy is a menace. She should tie him up. Mrs. W. U. — We've tried everything. What can I do?

Mrs. C. H. — Mrs. U. sends her 4-year-old Stevie out to play and he's like a mad dog. He bites. I've told my children to bite him back but they're repelled by the idea. You can report a dog to the Board of Health, but what can you do about a child who's let loose like that?

Mrs. W. U. — I have two other sons, 3 and 1. When Stevie was just a year-old baby he bit his new brother — we couldn't tell whether it was jealousy or a fierce love. When it continued we tried spanking, reasoning, depriving him of toys and treats. He does it less now.

In these enlightened days, however, his parents, particularly his mother, will be called on the carpet for producing so "unloveable" a child. Mrs. U.'s rescue-trail starts with one word: Why?
