Rep. Powell May Receive Summons

New York — (UPI) — Process servers will be seeking Rep. Adam Clayton Powell (D-N.Y.) starting Sunday with a summons requiring him to show cause why he should not be charged with a misdemeanor for allegedly attempting to defraud a creditor.

The creditor is Mrs. Esther James, a Harlem widow who won a \$211,200 libel judgment against Powell after he called her a "bag woman" (graft collector) for the police department. Mrs. James has been unable to collect from the Harlem legislator.

Tuesday, in Manhattan Criminal Court, she obtained a summons, signed by Judge Simon Silver, requiring Powell to show why he should not be charged with defrauding by diverting his income, a violation of the penal code.

Silver said the summons could be served any time after 1 p.m., this Sunday, with the aid of police, if necessary.
