Boston - Ty Cobb has been named the all-time top major league baseball player in the weekly poll of the Academy of Sports Editors, while Stan Musial of the St. Louis Cardinals, ranked seventh, was the only active player selected in the top ten.

The top ten, selected in order, are: Cobb, Babe Ruth, Rogers Hornsby, Honus Wagner, Joe DiMaggio, Walter Johnson, Musial, Christy Mathewson, Tris Speaker and Ted Williams.

Burelson Flies Home

Hannover, Germany - The U.S. men's track and field team, led by world champion pole vaulter John Penel, was a prohibitive favorite to beat a West German team today and atone for a crushing defeat suffered by the U.S. women's team.

Payton Jordan, coach of the U.S. men's team shuffled his lineup considerably for the two-day meet.

The sudden decision of American miler Dyrrol Burelson to fly back to the United States had nothing to do with Jordan's change of assignments, the coach explained. Burelson, bothered by back trouble, said he was returning to the U.S. for "personal reasons."

Carr Switched

Jordan switched Henry Carr of Arizona State from the 200 meters to the 400 and assigned Bob Hayes of Florida A. and M. to run in the 200 meters as well as the 100 meters.

Miller Tom O'Hara of Loyola of Chicago was changed to the 800 meters and Morgan Groth of Oregon State switched from the 800 to the 1,500 meters.

Jordan was hoping the change of assignments would help the U.S. men's team score the same kind of victory over West Germany that it did against Russia and Poland.

Ron White Named To Shrine All-Stars

Portland - Pendleton tackle Ron White has been named to the State team for the 16th annual Shriner's Hospital all-star football game at Multnomah Stadium Aug. 17.

White, who is 5-11 and 185 pounds, was picked to replace North Salem tackle Loren Whittaker on the 27-man squad. The State and Metropolitan all-star teams will report in Portland next Sunday for two weeks of practice.

Utah Girl Wins Skating Title

Portland - A 12-year-old girl from Utah picked off her second straight national skating title Monday night to high-light competition in the second day of the North American Roller Skating championships.

Mary Sue Wilcox of Ogden captured the junior girls' freeskating championship. She took the juvenile girls' freeskating title last year.

Wayne Melton and Stephanie Gruber of San Jose, Calif., won the novice pairs' freeskating crown. Dennis Rossman and Mary Belle Mistison of Renton, Wash., were second.

The intermediate dance championship went to Ronald Bragg and Barbara Jo Fish of Akron, Ohio. Jeff Philla-abaum of Middleton, Ohio, took first in the juvenile "B" boys' freeskating event.

LA Dodgers Trade With Washington

Los Angeles - The Los Angeles Dodgers announced Tuesday that they are trading veteran relief pitcher Ed Roebuck to the Washington Senators for utility infielder Marv Breeding.

Roebuck, with the Dodgers since 1949, was credited with 10 wins against 2 losses last year and was on the mound in the 1955 and 1956 World Series. In 29 games this season, he won 2 and lost 4.

Breeding, 29, played with Baltimore for three years before going to the Senators and was hitting .268 for Washington. He is capable of playing all three infield positions - second, first and short.

Both players will report immediately to their clubs.

The action was the latest in a series of changes for the Dodgers, who Monday night broke a four-game losing streak. They have brought up two players from their chief farm club and sent two down in addition to the trade with Washington.
