

Miller Brothers Capture Crowns In SO Junior Links Tournament

Two Medford brothers, sons of prominent golfing parents, captured championships yesterday in the Southern Oregon Junior Golf tournament at Rogue Valley Country club.

Mike Miller needed two extra holes to annex the junior boys mantle in the two-day, 36-hole medal play tourney at the Medford links. His brother, Greg, claimed the boys crown by two strokes in straight 36.

Other champions in the Monday-Tuesday tussle were Sue Lance, Woodland Hills, Calif., junior girls; Barbara Saunders, Grants Pass, girls, and Reed Morrison, Klamath Falls, pee wee boys.

Miller and Bob Rennie, Eugene, each fired 73 on Monday and 75 yesterday for duplicate 148s for the regulation distance. The totals were four over par for the tourney. On the first extra hole yesterday the playoff foes parred. On the second Miller won the hole and the title with another par.

Greg Has 153

Greg Miller garnered his first place trophy on a 75-78-153 card. Stan Smith, Roseburg, was runnerup with 79-78-155.

Miss Lance, who was one over ladies for two days, shot 78-77-153 to pace the junior girls field by 11 strokes. Second in the division was Peggy Saunders, Grants Pass, with 86-78-164.

Barbara Saunders totaled 83-85-168 in the girls bracket. Pam Fox, Corvallis, followed with 85-86-171.

Morrison's pee wee tabulation was 96-93-189, while Terry Rasmussen, Medford, was next with 96-98-194.

The Miller champions are sons of Dr. and Mrs. William Miller.

Three rounds of 73—one over course standard—were the best yesterday. These were shot by 1962 champ Rich Knight and Doug Olson, both Medford, in the junior boys tussle and by Chuck Milne, Salem, in the boys division.

Olson, state junior match play champ, who skied to an 80 on Monday used his 73

to gain a 153 and third place trophy. Knight was fourth in the division with a 154 after a Monday 81.

Play-off for Third

Milne won a two-hole play-off for boys third place after he and Mike Cloney, Eureka, Calif., finished with two-day 156s. Milne was 83-73 and Cloney 77. Following Milne in yesterday's play were three with 76s. In addition to Steve

Smith they were Bob Anet, Lake Oswego, and Jack Rice Tillamook.

Peggy Saunders 78, two over women's par, was closest to the 77 of Miss Lance among the lassies yesterday. Barbara Saunders 85 was best for the girls division. Morrison's 93 was tops among the pee wees.

Steve Morrison, Portland, boys winner in 1962, was nine strokes off the victory pace

with a 162. Juli Heath, Grants Pass, who gained the junior girls prize last summer, was way back of the 1963 winner with a 200 card.

Blow by Blanchard Breaks Deadlock as Yankees Defeat KC

Okay, all you baseball experts, which player is principally responsible for the Yankees winning this year?

Sorry, but no matter who you name, you're dead wrong.

And if you intend to argue about it, better take your case to Ralph Houk, who claims the Yankees are winning ball games not because of any one player but only because of their fine bench.

"I'm convinced beyond the slightest possible doubt that we have the best bench in baseball," Houk says. "Without it, we would never have had a chance this year, especially with injuries to such fellows as Mickey Mantle and Roger Maris."

"Everytime I look up though, our bench wins another ball game for us."

Houk is referring to such fill-ins as Johnny Blanchard, Harry Bright, Phil Linz, Jack Reed and even player-coach Yogi Berra.

It was Blanchard's turn Tuesday night. Even though he had been discharged from the hospital only a few hours earlier following a four-day bout with bronchitis, Blanchard took over right field when Maris showed up with a sprained left hand and delivered a tie-breaking single in the eighth inning that helped the Yankees beat the Kansas City A's, 6 to 2.

Bouton Won 14th

Jim Bouton recorded his 14th victory against five defeats with a seven-hitter but he was locked in a 2-all tie with loser Moe Drabowski until Blanchard broke the deadlock. The Yanks then added three more runs in the same frame. Wayne Causey had a homer and two doubles for the losers.

The victory kept the Yankees eight games in front of the second-place Chicago White Sox, who beat the Washington Senators, 5-1.

In other American league games, Baltimore downed Detroit, 9-0, Minnesota bumped Boston, 8-3, Los Angeles scored a 6-4 victory over Cleveland in 10 innings and Chicago defeated Washington, 5-1.

Milt Pappas held the Tigers to four hits in winning his 10th game for the Orioles. Brooks Robinson drove in four runs for Baltimore with his sixth homer and two singles while Al Smith had four of the Orioles' 18 hits. Hank Aguirre (9-10) was the loser. Lemen Homered

Jim Lemon's three-run homer off loser Don Rudolph in the sixth inning clinched the White Sox' victory over the Senators. It was Lemon's first homer since returning to the AL from the Phillies.
