

City Tennis Tourney On Saturday, Sunday

The event, sponsored by the Medford city recreation department, will be divided into six divisions. Climax to the tournament will be on Sunday when the men's and women's division winners will compete in semifinals and then finals events for the championships.

Fishing Varies in Forest, Report of Officials Shows

Fishing is fair at Fish Lake, poor to fair on all waters in the Applegate area, good on the Prospect ranger district, "slow" in the Butte Falls ranger district lakes but better in the streams and fair on the Union Creek district.

This is the report for the week end issued by the Rogue River National Forest service in the interests of recreationists.

The snow is gone, the trails are open just about any place recreationists may choose to go on the Rogue River forest. Campgrounds on the Applegate district are open but campers are still required to check with ranger stations before using Beaver Sulphur and Cook and Green campgrounds. All users are cautioned against broken glass buried in the sand.

Wildflowers in the Dutchman area on the Applegate district are in full bloom.

Heavy logging traffic and construction are mentioned as hazards that motorists should be on the lookout for in several sections. On the Ashland district all roads are open but the Loop and Tolman roads should be entered with caution, foresters warn, because of construction traffic from the Mt. Ashland Ski development.

Lodgepole road on the Butte Falls district is being used by loggers and there is surfacing work under way on the Blue Rock road, Woodruff Creek, Abbott Creek and Woodruff Access roads also are being used on week days by a heavy logging operation. In this same category are Hershberger, Prairie Creek and Wizard Creek roads.

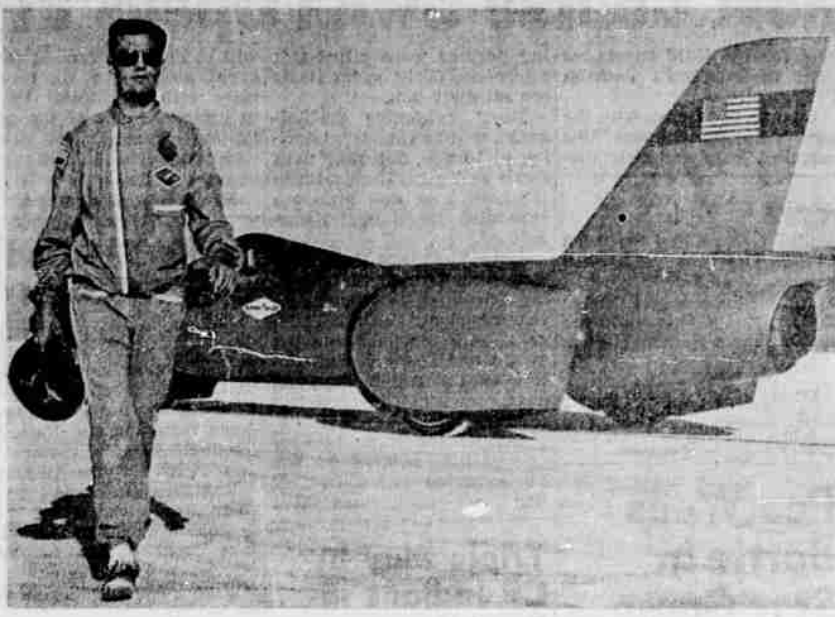
Lyons Named

Jim Walker, hard-driving lead-footed jalopy jockey from Talent, leads all contenders for high point honors at the conclusion of two races in the Medford speedway competition at White City.

Walker has amassed 160 points behind the wheel of No. 97 car, a 1954 Buick. He collected 60 counters in the season's first race and added another 100 in the July 21 affair.

Burton Achieves Switch Hit Honor

Off-traded Ellis Burton of the Cubs, a tough man to keep tabs on because he never stays in one place too long, landed in the record book for keeps today—alongside Mickey Mantle.

That's a pretty tall order for a guy with an undistinguished 224 lifetime batting average, but Burton managed it Thursday night when he became the eighth player in major league history to hit home runs from both sides of the plate in one game.

The shopworn, switch-hitting Burton, whose only other

claim to fame is that he plays a hot trumpet off the field, accomplished Thursday night's feat while helping the Cubs beat the Braves, 10-2.

Batting right-handed, the 27-year-old Chicago outfielder set off a six-run rally with his fifth homer of the year off loser Denny LeMaster in the

first inning, then connected for his sixth homer while batting left-handed against reliever Rono Piche in the seventh.

In addition to his two homers Thursday night, Steve Boros and Jim Schaffer also homered for the Cubs as Larry Jackson set down the Braves on seven hits for his 12th victory against nine losses. Lemaster's loss was his sixth compared with seven victories.

By winning, the Cubs solidified their hold on fourth place and moved to within 6 1/2 games of the idle first-place Dodgers.

The St. Louis Cardinals climbed into a tie for second place with San Francisco by defeating the Cincinnati

Reds, 3-2, in the only other National league game scheduled.

The only game scheduled in the American League was Boston at Baltimore and it was rained out.
