Enliven Menu With Versatile Grapes
This is surely the season to help yourself and satisfy your appetite for fresh grapes. Spilling out of the horn-of-plenty through summer and fall, Thompson Seedless provide about 70 per cent of grapes in today's markets. Grape-growing is the world's biggest fruit industry. There are thousands of varieties of grapes throughout the world, of which less than 30 have commercial importance. Among these are Cardinals, Tokays, Red and White Malagas, Ribier and Emperors. Grapes are grown in Europe, Western Asia, the Near East, South Africa, Australia, Mexico, South America and in many parts of the United States. About 92 per cent of all grapes and almost 100 per cent of table grapes used in this country are grown in California.

There are hundreds of delicious ways of eating fresh grapes—for breakfast, lunch, dinner or snacks. Here are suggestions for appetizers, meat accompaniments, salads and desserts depending on grapes for appetite appeal. **Grape Cocktail.** Combine two parts grapes (seedless or seeds removed) with one part diced ripe avocados. Toss with French dressing and chill one-half hour. Serve as appetizer on beds of lettuce garnished with fresh parsley. **Grape Cole Slaw.** Combine in a bowl three cups shredded cabbage, two cups grapes (seedless or seeds removed), 1 1/2 teaspoons salt, one-eighth teaspoon ground black pepper, one tablespoon fresh lemon juice and one-quarter cup mayonnaise. Toss lightly and serve garnished with whole grapes. Six servings.

Grape and Ham Salad. For four salads, toss together lightly 1 1/2 cups cold cooked ham, three-quarter cup diced celery, one cup green seedless grapes, one-half teaspoon salt, dash of pepper and one-quarter cup mayonnaise. Serve on beds of lettuce garnished with green seedless grapes. **Vanilla Grapes and Banana Cream.** Toss together lightly one cup sliced bananas, one cup grapes (seedless or seeds removed), three-quarter cup bite-sized marshmallows, one cup dairy sour cream and one teaspoon pure vanilla extract. Serve in sherbet glasses garnished with whole grapes. Makes six servings. **Croatian Stuffed Mushrooms.** Favorite of Yugoslavians. Home Ownership Break Provided In Tax Program

Washington—(UPI)—Congressional tax writers have unanimously approved legislation designed to make home ownership one of the best hedges that an American can take against inflation. The House Ways and Means committee Wednesday affirmed by a 22-0 vote an earlier decision to add special benefits for home owners to the across-the-board rate reductions in income taxes President Kennedy wants enacted this year. The provision would grant a "once in a lifetime" tax break to taxpayers who sell their homes for a profit after reaching the age of 65. The Treasury estimated that it would mean tax savings of 10 million a year to elderly homeowners.

The biggest revenue producer—denial of U.S. tax deductions for payment of state and local taxes on gasoline, cigarettes, alcohol and auto tags—accounted for \$800 million of the total.
