

# Cards Blank Phillies, 7-0; Giants Top Cubs; Mets Lose

Ernie Broglio, outlasting the 100 degree heat, pitched the St. Louis Cardinals to a two-hit victory over the Philadelphia Phillies Saturday and gained his fifth shutout of the season, 7-0.

Broglio lost a chance for a one-hitter with two men out in the ninth inning when catcher Clay Dalrymple singled. The only other Phillie to hit safely was Ruben Amaro, who grounded a single into right in the second inning. It was Broglio's fourth two-hit shutout of the year.

Carl Sawatski led the St. Louis offense with three runs batted in, including a two-run homer.

**Raised Average**  
Dick Groat raised his league-leading batting average six points to .342 as he went 4 for 5 Saturday and batted in a run. He has now collected 150 hits for the year.

Sawatski smashed a two-run homer off John Boomer in the seventh inning and bat-

ted in another run with a single during the three-run Cardinal eighth inning. Curt Flood's bases loaded double accounted for the last two Cardinal runs in that inning, all off Bobby Locke. Starter Cal McLish suffered the loss.

In other National League afternoon games, the Milwaukee Braves tripped the New York Mets, 10-7; San Francisco Giants topped the Chicago Cubs 9-5, and the Pittsburgh Pirates edged the Cincinnati Reds, 5-4.

**Added Homer**  
Eddie Mathews ran his hitting streak to 16 games and drove home three runs to lead the Braves' 15-hit attack against the Mets. Joe Torre added a two-run homer and Roy McMillan delivered a key pinch-single to bring home two runs for the Braves.

Willie McCovey and Willie Mays slugged home runs for the Giants to earn reliever Jack Fisher the victory. McCovey's homer was his

32nd to give him the NL lead in that department. The triumph was the Giants' 10th in 12 games, breaking San Francisco's six-game losing streak at Wrigley Field.

Pittsburgh took advantage of a faulty Cincinnati defense to score five runs - four unearned - in the fifth and sixth innings and erase a 3-0 Cincinnati lead. Catcher Johnny Edwards contributed two errors and shortstop Eddie Kasko and losing pitcher John Tsitouris one each.

The Los Angeles Dodgers met the Houston Colts in the only NL night game.

## Britons Upset Crack U.S. Relay Team, But Yanks Lead in Score

London (AP) - America's record-conscious 440-yard relay suffered a stunning upset in the first day of the U.S. - Britain track and field meet Saturday but the American men piled up a 61-44 team and the U.S. women managed to trail by only one point, 25-27.

The U.S. men broke two British "all comers" records - Hayes Jones of Detroit winning the 120-yard high hurdles in 13.8 seconds and Ralph Boston of Los Angeles broad jumping 25 feet, 10 inches. The "world's fastest human" Bob Hayes tied the White City stadium record by winning the 100-yard dash in 9.5 seconds on the rain-soaked track.

In addition to Jones, Hayes, and Boston, other U.S. men winners were Bob Humphreys of Los Angeles in the discus throw with 185 feet, 9 inches; Tom O'Hara of Loyola of Chicago in the one mile run in 4:03.0; Gene Johnson of California in the high jump with six feet, 8 inches, and Ullis Williams of Arizona State in the 440-yard run in 46.7 seconds.

Besides winning the 440-yard relay, Britain picked up a surprise victory in the hammer throw as Howard feet, 4 inches and an ex-Payne heaved the weight 207 feet in the six-mile run as Ron Hill led the way in 27:36.0.

Sandra Knott of Cleveland broke the American record for 880 yards to win that event in the women's competition in 2:10.7, nosing out Britain's Joy Catling. Other U.S. women winners were Rosie Bond of Riverside, Calif., in the 80-meter high hurdles in 1:11 seconds and Cynthia Wyatt of Honolulu in the shot put with 48 feet, 4 1/2 inches.

British women victors were Susan Platt in the javelin with 166 feet, 8 1/2 inches and Dorothy Hyman in the 220-yard dash in 23.8 seconds.

A heavy rain fell up to the start of the meet, soaking the track so badly that water had to be swept off for the first event. The bad weather also held the crowd to 5,000 in the 42,000 seat arena.

On the other hand, the U.S. women's team which was soundly whipped on this European tour by Russia, Poland, and West Germany, won three of five events and came within an eyelash of holding the team lead at the end of the first day. The meet concludes Monday.

# Blanchard Clouts Pair as Yanks Snap Oriole Streak

Johnny Blanchard's two booming home runs and the dazzling New York Yankee infield combined Saturday to produce a 3-2 victory that snapped the Baltimore Orioles' four-game winning streak.

Relief pitcher Bill Stafford saved Al Downing's seventh triumph when he entered with two on and one out in the ninth inning after the Orioles had cut the Yankee lead to one run. Stafford deliberately walked Russ Snyder to fill the bases and then threw only one pitch to Luis Aparicio, who hit into a double play.

Earlier, in the sixth inning, a brilliant double play started by third baseman Clete Boyer balled Downing out of a jam.

Blanchard hit his eighth homer of the season to tie the score at 1-1 in the fifth inning and put the Yankees ahead with another homer in the seventh.

The Yankees scored what proved to be the winning run in the eighth when Tom Tresh walked, went to third on a single by Joe Pepitone, and scored on a wild pitch by Milt Pappas.

Rookie Don Wert drove home three runs and Rocky Colavito knocked in two runs to pace the Detroit Tigers to a 7-5 victory over the Cleveland Indians in the American league's only other afternoon game.

The Tigers staked Phil Regan to a 6-2 lead in the third inning, but the big righthander weakened in the seventh and Terry Fox came on to preserve the victory. Woodie Held and Al Lupton hit homers for Cleveland.
