Butts Attorneys Sharpen Up for Final Arguments

By LEON DANIEL Atlanta-UPB - Attorneys in Wallace Butts' \$10 million libel suit against the Saturday Evening Post sharpened their final arguments for the curtain ringer next week to one of college football's sharpest controversies.

The trial was in recess this week, ending following two weeks of testimony and arguments in federal court. The 12-man jury is expected to get the case late Monday after final summations are concluded and Federal Judge Lewis R. Morgan instructs them.

Butts, the round little man who once led powerful football teams from the University of Georgia to Southeastern conference championships and into the nation's bowl games, was pictured alternately Friday of a lover of night life and a man ruined by a slanderous story.

The Post claimed in an issue last March that Butts, while athletic director at Georgia, gave away football secrets to Alabama coach Paul (Bear) Bryant prior to last fall's Alabama-Georgia football game.

Both heatedly denied the allegations and both sued for \$10 million. Bryant's suit is still pending in the federal court in Birmingham where Post attorneys are trying to get it

WHITE SOX' GARY PETERS STRETCHES STREAK TO 8

United Press International Rookie lefthander Gary Peters ran his winning streak to eight consecutive games Saturday in pitching the Chicago White Sox to a 2-0 four-hit shutout of the New York Yankees.

The win boosted Peters' season record to 13-5 and restored the White Sox to second place in the American league, 8 1/2 games behind the Yankees.

The White Sox gave Peters a two-run cushion at the expense of Al Downing, the Yankee southpaw who worked seven innings and suffered his fourth setback.

Peters, undefeated since the all star break, has built up his winning string over a 37-day span. It was his fourth

shutout of the campaign and reduced his earned run average to 1.88, best in the American league.

Ward Gets RBIs Rookie third baseman Pete Ward drove in both Chicago runs. Ward's sacrifice fly with the bases loaded in the first inning scored Mike Hersherberger, and he singled home Jim Lemon from second base in the fifth inning.

Bennie Daniels surrendered only two singles and Washington batters pounded four Minnesota hurlers for 13 hits, including four home runs, as the Senators bombed the Twins, 10-0. Daniels' victory, his fourth in 12 decisions, bounced the Twins into third place behind Chicago.

Carl Yastrzemski, leading batter in the American league, drove in four runs on three hits, including a two-run homer in the first inning, to lead the Boston Red Sox to a 10-3 rout of the Cleveland Indians. Bill Monbouquette pitched his 10th complete game of the year as he raised his record to 16-7. Lou Clinton and Frank Malzone also homered for the Sox.
