Naturally, the best results have been obtained by the experts in Minneapolis who have "frozen" hundreds of stomachs.

A number of physicians around the country who are now reporting results not as good as those obtained in Minneapolis are suggesting that men with mild ulcers and bearable symptoms wait a while until the technic is perfected.

There is a letter in the New England Journal of Medicine in which a physician reported one very bad result.

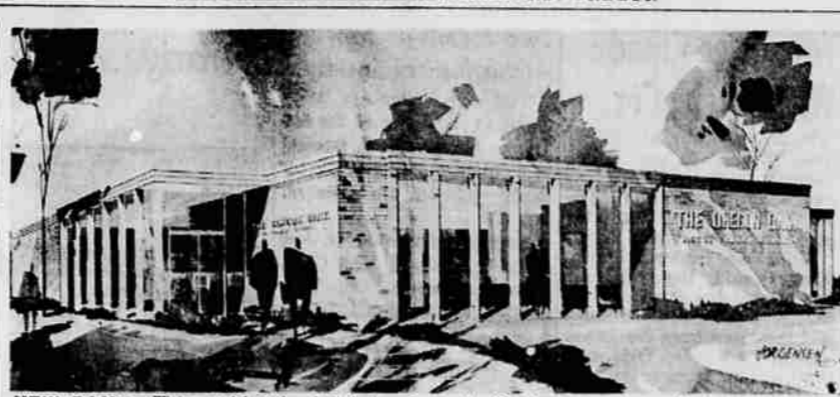
