### Hopes Dashed for Higher Dividend

New York — (UPI) — Hopes of more than 2,200,000 stockholders of American Telephone & Telegraph Co. that they might be in line for a higher dividend were dashed Wednesday when the world's biggest corporate entity announced no change in the payment rate. The AT&T directors voted to continue paying the 90 cents a share which has been paid since July, 1961 when the dividend was raised from 82½ cents. The latest dividend is payable Oct. 1 to holders of record Aug. 30. However, Wall Street foresaw the possibility of an increase in the dividend later this year if the giant utility's rise to the estimated \$6 a share for all of this year compared with \$5.79 last year.

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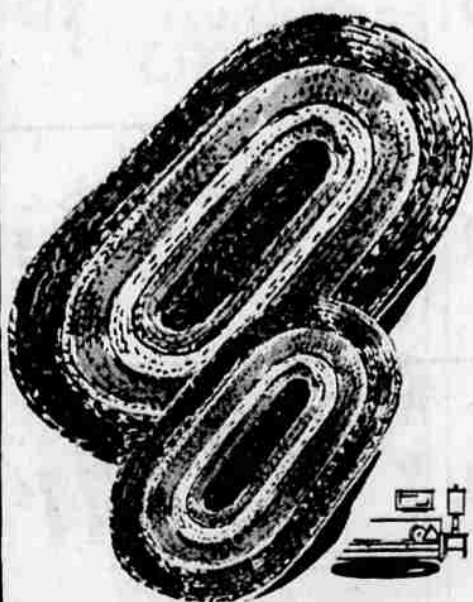
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
