The chapel was decorated with candelabra and baskets of flowers.

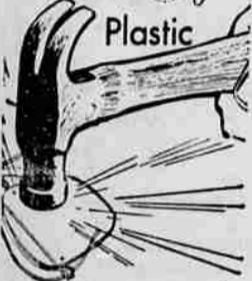

### OANE Plans Thursday Meeting

The first fall meeting of the Oregon Association of Nursery Education will be held at the Girls Community club, 229 North Bartlett street, Thursday, August 29, at 8 p.m.

Brief talks on the constitution, history and organization of OANE will be given and an outline of the year's program will be presented.

Membership in the pre-school association is open to teachers, directors and owners of all classifications of schools and organizations that are concerned with the education and welfare of pre-school aged children.

The association was formed in Jackson county in 1956 to provide opportunities for all those working with pre-school children, either professionally or on a volunteer basis, to come together for discussion, learning and observation.

Kindergartens are not a part of the Oregon system of education, therefore, there are no laws governing who shall direct a kindergarten or what shall be taught. For this reason a group of concerned teachers throughout the state met and formed the Oregon association. A committee was elected to study standards and procedures in all of the states and to propose adoption of the best of these for the members of the association.

Monthly meetings have been held and assistance with the programs has been provided by The Child Guidance clinic, Southern Oregon college, Dr. Phyllis Butler, a member of Southern Oregon college faculty, assistant superintendent of public schools, the elementary school supervisor, and teachers.
