Vale—(AP)—A 2-year-old rural Vale girl was recovering today after a vicious attack Tuesday by an eagle. Mary Lynn Pressley, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George Pressley, was walking down a driveway when the large bird jumped from weeds and attacked her.

Mrs. Pressley witnessed the attack and tried to beat off the bird. A neighbor, Joe Cuellar, also saw the attack, rushed out and killed the eagle.

The girl was treated for deep scratches on her head and around her eyes and mouth.

The eagle's head was sent to the Oregon State Health Department for examination for possible rabies.

Quotes From the News

By UNITED PRESS INTERNATIONAL Washington—Sen. Bourke B. Hickenlooper (R-Iowa) commenting on the nuclear test ban treaty to be considered by him and other members of the Foreign Relations committee: "The Senate has just as much a role in the treaty-making process as the President. He can't ratify a treaty without the Senate." Madrid—Clinton M. Jenks, disillusioned by the trip he and other students made to Cuba in defiance of a government ban: "I don't know how they lived before in Cuba, but I am sure the people of Cuba never lived worse than they do now." Washington—Chairman Oren Harris (D-Ark.) of the House Commerce committee, predicting there will be no nationwide railroad strike: "I don't think we'll have any trouble." Moab, Utah — Frank Tipplie, general manager of the plant where a mine shaft explosion trapped an estimated 25 construction workers: "We have every hope of getting through to the men."
