We must provide 'Little Washington' everywhere so that the Negro in the cotton field who can't go to Washington can have a chance to express himself."

Madrid — Clinton Jencks, 19, one of the American youth who made a two-month trip to Cuba as guests of Fidel Castro, in defiance of State Department edicts: "Now I know the truth about Cuba. The people are happy here."

Moab, Utah — Casper A. Nelson, state industrial commissioner, describing three victims of a mine blast here: "They had their heads in the ventilation tube trying to get fresh air. That's where they were when they were found."
