

# Smith, Robinson Win Medalist Laurels In Southern Oregon Links Meet at RVCC

## Match Play Under Way In Classic

Rogue Valley Country club's mammoth Southern Oregon Golf tournament headed into match competition today with Justin Smith, Dave Hill and Miss June Robinson holding the top-seeded positions in their respective championship brackets.

Smith, young Medford attorney, gained the No. 1 spot in the men's division match pairings with a low qualifying card in this 35th annual tourney. A two under par 70 shot on Tuesday, weathered Wednesday assault by out-of-towners to earn Smith the medalist prize.

Miss Robinson, Albany, a past champion in this tourney, was women's division low qualifier with a one over par 76 yesterday. Hill, Grants Pass, knotted with two others, past champ Carl Schmidt, Medford, and Frank Fisk, Portland, with 76 scores in the senior men's medalist Bob Smith Bids.

As the first round of match play began this morning 64 participants were paired in the men's championship flight. All other tourney flights had 16 entrants paired. Seeded No. 2 in their respective titular brackets were two defending champions, Miss Pam Stacey, Medford, in the women's tour-

qualified with a 74, drew Pat Lynch, Medford, this morning.

**432 Players**  
Bob Atkinson, Portland, three times victor, took on Paul Moore, Medford Lynn Creason, champ of 1958, teed off this afternoon with Robert H. Brown, Sonoma, Calif., as his adversary. Don Provost Jr., Ashland, whose crown was won in 1954, drew Dick House, Medford, as first round foe.

A total of 432 players were paired for match play. There were 256 in the men's division, 96 in the women's and 80 in the senior men's, equaling the field of 1962. After the title flight of 64 in the men's came 12 flights of 16 players each. There were six flights of ladies and five of senior men.

First round losers in the men's championship flight fall into the first flight and other men's losers go into consolation brackets. In seniors' and ladies' play opening round losers drop to lower flights.

Not all first round matches are being played today. In some flights they are set for Friday.

It took a qualifying score of 83 strokes or better to get into the men's championship competition. A drawing among those who had 83 up to John Nuich, Medford, and W. Match play in the tournament continues through Monday, Van Dyke in the titular play, Labor day, at the Medford links.

Residents of the Rogue valley are invited by tourney officials to help make the event a success by joining in the holiday spirit and turning out to watch the matches. There is no charge to galleries.

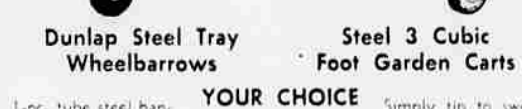
