Graham Blasts Broken Homes

Los Angeles - (UPI) - Evangelist Billy Graham worked Sunday night that America's prime problem is the broken home, a "malignant growth that eats its way into the vitals of national life."

The 15th day of Graham's current crusade drew 66,503 persons to Memorial Coliseum and swelled the total to about 600,000.

Graham explained that statistics alone do not fully reveal the depth of the divorce problem, nor tell of the many by-products of broken homes - young people in corrective institutions or faced with other problems.
