Texans Claim Largest Sign

Dallas, Tex.—(UPI)—Naturally, it would happen in Texas. A sign which its backers claim is the largest of its kind ever built in the United States has been put up in front of Dallas' Market hall.

The double-face sign is 30 feet high, 21 feet long, uses more than 3,000 50-watt high-intensity light bulbs, and 24 miles of wire to flash as many as 10 different messages on either side. Market hall is one of the nation's largest exhibition and convention halls with 213,000 square feet of space.

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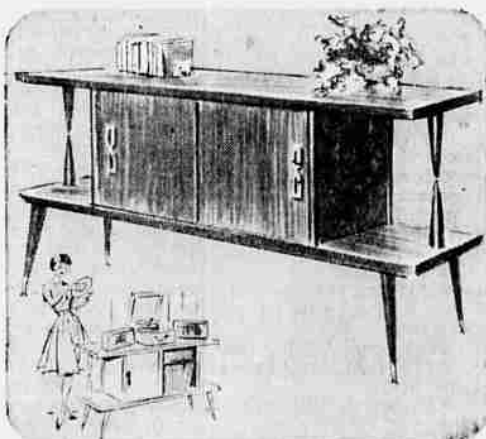
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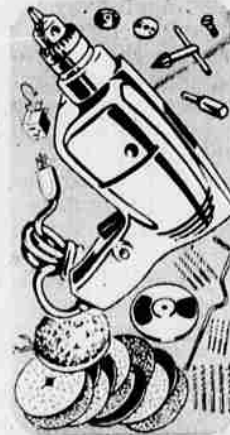
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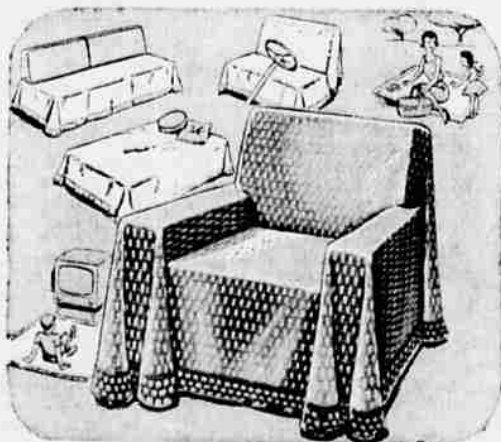
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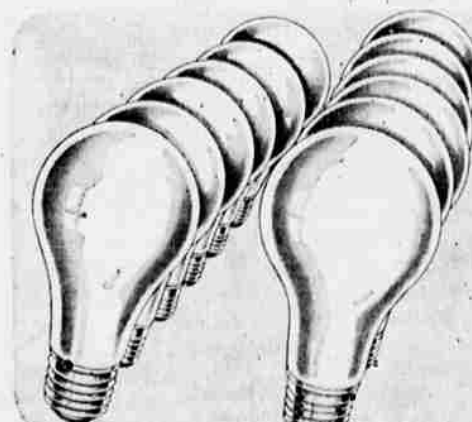
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
