

Candy Sale To Benefit Handicapped

Members of Epsilon Sigma Alpha international sorority in the Southern Oregon district will ring doorbells this week in a "sweet tooth" appeal for the Easter Seal society's Children's Hospital school in Eugene.

This appeal is the sorority's annual candy sale. Last year Oregon chapters donated \$11,700 to the school, which is ESA's statewide philanthropic project.

September 10, 11 and 12 are the dates chosen by the six chapters in Southern Oregon for the Brown and Haley mint sale. Last year these six chapters donated \$1,650 to the school.

At the recent ESA interna-

tional convention in Spokane, Wash., the Oregon council received the second place philanthropic award. This was based on a written report of hours and money donated by the 60 chapters in Oregon. The three area council philanthropic awards were all won by Oregon. They were Pendleton, first; Portland, second and Eugene, third.
