New Regulations Issued Against Bias In Employment

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The President's Committee on Equal Employment Opportunity has issued new regulations to carry out President Kennedy's order barring racial discrimination in employment or promotion on federally assisted construction projects.

The regulations were published in the Federal Register and will take effect immediately. They provide that each contractor and subcontractor working on projects aided in part by the federal government either through funds or loan guarantees must sign no-discrimination pledges.

Reports Required

Enforcement authority is vested in the heads of federal contracting agencies. Contractors are required to file regular compliance reports.

The regulations also require contractors to notify labor unions with which they deal of their commitments to ban discrimination. Agency heads have the power to direct contractors to file statements certifying that those unions follow non-discriminatory policies.

The President extended the committee's authority to include federally aided projects on June 22. Before that time, the group was charged with policing the federal ban on discrimination only in firms that held direct federal contracts.

The new order covers federal-state highway and hospital construction as well as homes built with the aid of federally guaranteed Veterans Administration or Federal Housing Administration mortgages.

Must Report Findings

Any worker or job applicant may file a complaint of discrimination with the government agency or the White House committee. The agencies are directed to investigate the complaints and report their findings to Robert Taylor, Jr., executive vice chairman of the committee, within 60 days.

The committee can cancel the contract of a discriminating employer or declare him ineligible for future government or government-assisted contracts.

Quintuplets Born In Venezuela

MARACAIBO, Venezuela —

(UPI) — Venezuela's first quintuplets were reported in excellent condition Sunday night, 48 hours after their birth.

The infants—all boys—were born Saturday to Mrs. Ines Cuervo, 27, wife of an oilfield worker from Ciudad Ojeda.

A spokesman at Maracaibo University Hospital reported all the quintuplets were in incubators, but were taking their special milk formula normally. He said they weighed 3.08 to 3.96 pounds each and averaged 14.1 inches in length.

Mrs. Cuervo, the mother of five other children, had been under special observation at the hospital for several months.
